





Gin Mishap Is Fatal For Man At Turkey

Jasper N. Majors, 27-year-old Turkey gin worker, died in Lubbock Memorial hospital at 12:20 a.m. today, a little more than eight hours after his right arm was caught in a bale saw at the West Texas cotton gin in Turkey.

The accident occurred about 4 p.m. Thursday. Majors was brought to Lubbock by a Turkey ambulance, arriving here about 7:30 p-m.

His arm was badly mangled and nearly servered, necessitating an amputation about half way between the elbow and shoulder.

Death apparently resulted from extreme loss of blood and shock due to the accident, and the LAPSE OF TIME BETWEEN THE INJURY AND ARRIVAL IN LUBBOCK.
