





In fact, it has an advantage over popcorn. The hulls are thinner-easier to chew and less likely to get caught between the teeth. A disadvantage is the fact that pop-sorghum doesn't blow itself basis. Both parties should profit into as big kernels as popcorn.

Reports from the sorghum prosorghum is handier for candy and caramel confections, than popcorn, just a tasty, and may also become popular as a breakfast food. Pop-sorghum was developed by crossing two varieties of sorghum-Haiti's petite mil and India's shallu. It isn't available yet for planting generally although a few seedmen have small quantities.



Veterans Education Program Revised

Dickens county veterans who 1.000 are interested in the county vocational school program will be concerned over the "corrected copy" of Veterans Administration regulations dated April 1, 1950.

A recent copy of the regulations concerning the pursuit on or after July 25, 1951, of courses of education or training under the Servicemen's Readjustment Act states in part: "The law provides that ourse of education or training be of four years after the date of discharge or by July 25, 1951, who enlisted under the Voluntary Act of October 6, 1945."

"A veteran may change his course of education or training course and will enable him to attain his educational or vocational objective.

According to the report, wher veteran completes his course of education or discontinues his elected course of training, the new law does not permit the initia-tion of another course of educa-
