

The pecan shelling industry is changing from Chicago and St. Louis to Texas. One of the largest of the Chicago concerns has incorporated a subsidiary company, known as the Texohola Pecan Shellers, Inc., of San Antonio, which will employ some 400 people. No doubt this will be followed by others, before many years Texas pecans will practically all be shelled in Texas and marketed from this


