Farm Numbers Decreasing
U. 8. tarme are decreasing in number and increasing in sise. Farms in Texas are no exception to the general rul. There are now approximataly 304,000 farms in Texas com pared to 506,000 in 1931, the yoar in which flarms in this state reached their peak in numbers:
This comparison is based on revised estl mates of census figures up to 1956, as reported by the U. S. Department of Agriculture. In

aging $\$ 27,000$ this year, according to other Department of Agriculture research.
Nationally, the total acreage of cropiand harvested in 1957 is about the same as in 1940 . But the size of farms has risen about 40 per cent since that time and output per larm is up 4 per cent. Farm output per man hour has more than doubled, and the average larm worker now produces enough food and tiber for himself and 20 others.

Meat packing be one of the oldest ente. prisees in Amarica. The induatry was actual: born three centuries ago in the Connecticul River Valloy. Sottiore raised corn, fod and fattoned livestock, and saltod down beet and pork producte in barrels for shipment to the colonies.
Then the western migration began, and the livestock pattern established in the east was followed there. The supply became eo great that a meat packing conter was establishod in Cincinnati. From that eity sealted meate went to Atlantic ports and abroad
The expansion of the nations reilway sysutem in the post-Civill War period had a revolutionary affect on packing. Vast western range lands could now be reachad, and their cettio
