Fort Worth. Texas. — Migration of negroes from the South to the North has practically stopped, Carl M. Rosenquist, faculty member of Texas University, told the migration and immigration section of the Texas Conference of Social Welfare here.

"Progress of the South, including the building of more industries, has brought a southern demand for labor. This is helping to keep the negro in the South. Wages are somewhat better and more jobs exist in the South than in the past. Of course there always will be a movement of negroes to the North even if it is on a small basis, but the migration of negroes from the North back to the South will overcome this."
