



Inclosing or screening the manure pit or bin is a great help in controlling this pest. Tent traps or conical traps, placed over holes large enough to attract flies to the light may be atached to the top of the pit or bin. Wateright floors are desirable in a stable. Ditt or wooden floors enable many fly larvae to mi-grate from the manure to the soil and develop there.
