mers get together and pass resolutions to organize and then perfect the organization by electing a president, secretary, treasurer and a board of directors. They draft a constitution and by-laws to suit the conditions of the organization. Then a business manager is selected by the board of directors or by the body, according to the idea of the membership.

The membership agrees in a partnership that will all sell dairy products together under test and share proportionately in the profits derived. A small per cent of the sales is set aside to pay the expenses of divided among the membership af-

ter expenses have been pand. By such methods all big creameries can get in touch with the organization, or its business manager, and offer a much better price for the large quantities than can be paid for smaller quantities such as a single farmer would have to sell. Again, it would eliminate the profits of the speculator that makes it a business to live off the farmer. These funds would go into the farmers pockets





A twenty-four thousand egg capacity hatchery will ge installed at Jacksboro in time for the spring hatching.

A. B. Davis, Manger of the Lubbock Board of City Development, has been named city manager of Lubbock. He will continue his connections with the Board of City Development.

Bills have been introduced in both the National House and Senate carrying substantial appropriations for exploration and development of the potash deposits in Westen Texas. These deposits are said to be comparable with the great German deposits which now constitute the world's sole supply. Senator Morris Sheppard and Representative Claude Hudspeth are authors of the bill.

Sugar beet culture has proven practicable in the shallow water belt f the Plains. The Halsell Farms at Amherst, experimented with the crop this year and met with great success. Heavy yields of fine quality beets was made. It is planned to try the crop on a larger scale next year and if it proves successful to go after a sugar factory and encourage the crop on a great scale.

Wheeler county now has under construction a nice new court house, the cost of which will be \$70,000.00. The growing little city of Wheeler is very proud of this addition to its growth.

Shamrock is erecting another fine Church building which will cost around \$50,000 when completed.




