Pardoned Offender

"He makes refrence to the fact that I had assistance in the prosecution of the flogging cases of Williamson towns: Crosbyton, Ralls, Lorenzo, County. I am wondering who helped Lubbock, Brownfield, Lamesa, Stockhim in making up his mind to have the Governor restore the citizenship of one or more of the men convicted in those prosecutions.

"He condonned the offense of at least one of these men by having the Governor restore his citizenship.

"Mr. Ferguson's own supporters and friends will not believe him sincere in his attempt to revive the klan question and try to make it clear that I am in sympathy with the klan. My record in this matter as made in the courthouse is far better than his made on the stump, and mine has the quality of consistency and his likes consistency in any number of instances.

Hints at Deal "I wonder who persuaded him to espouse the cause of the Klan candidate for Speaker of the House of Representative in January 1925. I wonder if he ever read any of the letters that went to the members of the klan in the ligislature, telling them that if the ments made to kill all anti-klan legislation except the anti-mask bill. If they had these arrangements made maybe he could tell the people of Texas with whom they were made. It is singular to note that the amnesty bill passed, that it was supported by men who were known to belong to the klan and that the bill requiring members of secret orders to register their membership did not pass, notwithstanding the fact that it was a platform demand of the Democratic Party. "He complains because certain individuals whom he names are supporting my candidacy. The business which he says they represent were subscribers for expensive advertising in the "good will" edition of the Ferguson Forum. My idea is that they are tired of Fergusonism and don't want to be mulched again for costly space which possess no advertising value.

"His attempt to explain the American Road Company Contract is both ridiculous and pathetic. He ought to go down to the courthouse at Austin and read the judgment of the court holding that the price fixed in that contract was unreasonable and unconscionable, and that the contracts were made in abuse of official discretion. I wonder how he explains the verdict of the jury in the Hoffman Construction Company Case. I wonder how he explains the resignation of Lanham and Burkett. I wonder how he explains the lugging of that money off to Kansas City and its investment in Liberty Bonds, and the fact that these bonds were secreted in a safety deposit box in a Kansas City Bank. These things he does not attempt to try to explain.

Private Aid Given Credit Moody's relentless prosecution of ed by Ferguson as reflecting the success of the private prosecutors. One "It looked like in that day that of the private prosecutors admitted to him he said, that he and not Moody was responsible for the success of the prosecution.

"It may be of interest to our anti-Klan friends to know that Dan Moody," Ferguson said, "this great Klan convictor, has quietly agreed with the Klan attorneys of Murray Jackson, who received the highest sentence in these prosecutions, to recommend his pardon when Jackson has served one year, notwithstanding that he has a sentence of five years. If Mr. Moody wants to deny this statement then I am ready to produce the letter of the attorneys showing this agreement."

It is to be recalled that Jackson Sheriff and Tax Collectr: carried his fight for liberty through the higher courts, and failing in the State courts sought without effort relief from Judge James C. Wilson. He was represented in this litigation by Joe Burkett, former member of the Highway Commission, appointed by Mrs. Fergguson, but resigned after Moody's prosecution of the American Road Company suit.

Ferguson, made it clear, however, that he himself had offered the Olive Branch to former Klansmen.

He said: "In this connection it will perhaps be well to refere to the Status of the Democratic Party on the Klan quescion in Texas. 




