





Love.—Reporter. it—and I thought it would be a good poost for the cotton farmer if he could prove to the public that he was making money raising cotton by loaning me a small amount on good se-

Now, I don't know who this "Mr. A. Mixer" is, but he had a very good idea of the success I had with those three old sows. But, he was wholly wrong when he thinks I am going to rent land and work all summer raising cotton when I have no assurance of the price in the fall. If only reasonable amount of cotton would be grown so as to insure the stability of the price, then I would not hesitate to grow some cotton. But, most of us farmers will not play fair with each other. When the talk of cotton crop reduction sets in and farmers make up their mind to reduce and have a good price, then some fellows who have quite a large acreage of land says, "If others reduce the price will be good, and I'll plant all cotton this year and clean-up." And he generally does clean-up, as ninety per cent of his neighbors have the same idea and all of them sell their cotton

I am making a little money in the hog business. If the price goes too low, I still have meat for my family. Generally, I can trade hams to the Dry Goods men for clothing and can trade bacon to the groceryman for beans. I can have bacon and beans, sausage and many other good things to eat which are directly or indirectly the product of my hogs. My one butter we have needed, and the chickens have supplied the eggs and drum-sticks.

Yes, I wanted that money to buy weighed 124 pounds. a few cows, and as farmers are so strong on raising cotton, I felt sure that some of them would have money to let. And I could get the money to buy the cows that I would not enter competition with them in raising cotton. Then they would make more money with their cotton crop.

I figured it out this way. My three old sows averaged a profit of around \$140.00 apiece this year, and I thought if I could get about eight or rivals. 




