In Memory of Letha Inez Hagins

Letha Inez Hagins was born July the 15th, 1927, died Oct. the 20th, age three months and five days. The funeral services conducted by Rev. I. A. Smith, pastor of the First Methodist church of Spur were held in the First Baptist church of Spur, the following day at three o'clock in the afternoon, after which interment was made in the Spur cemetery. A large crowd of relatives and friends came to sympathize with the stricken parents and to pay tribute to the dead. There was many beautiful floral offerings and a large procession followed the hearse that bore the body of baby Inez to her final resting place, to await the voice of Him who said: "Suffer the little children to come unto me, for of such is the kingdom of Heaven."

Little Letha Inez has gone. She was the only wee baby near Gilpin, and was the pride and joy of the whole neighborhood. But death has closed her bright blue eyes. Her little voice on earth is crushed. The angels claimed her for the skies—how oft our fondest hopes are crushed! Yes, the heart of the young father and mother is crushed, their fondest hopes blighted and their home made desolate, because little Inez has flown away. For though the Bible says for us to weep at their birth and to rejoice at their death, and we know God's word is true, frail human nature will not have it so. Their hearts are broken.

How the whole neighborhood rejoiced with the happy young couple when the glad news went round: "Jesse and Emma have a girl!" And how we rushed to their side with endearing congratulations, and when later, the word came that the little one was not doing well, a deadly fear gripped our hearts, and we looked at one another, thinking, not saying, "Oh, what if she should die?"

Those who stood by the little white casket in their own home will know how lonesome they will be. Thrice has the death angel entered our home. Two beautiful baby girls and a baby boy flew away and left us. They went to make Heaven dearer, nearer and brighter to us than it could ever have otherwise been. It broke our hearts to part from them but now they are more pleasure to us than anything on earth. Because we know they are safe with Jesus. Sin and death cannot harm them there. There they can never fall into wicked hands. They can never suffer persecution, nor pain, their hearts will never be broken through the infidelity of a loved one, for safely sheltered by the Rock of Ages, they are now free from all those things forevermore. Little Inez has joined them. She was too sweet and fair a flower to blossom in a world of woe. God gave to her a heavenly bower, where storms never blow; the Father doeth all things well—He willed it so.

Dear bereaved one—we realize that words are futile now. We can only point you to Him who is an ever present help in time of trouble. He alone can help you through the following sad days while you are learning to get along without her. "Weeping may endure for a night, but joy will come in the morning." Oh, what a joyful moment it will be when you clasp her in your arms again. Till then, goodbye, sweet little one. Blossom and bloom in God's garden till we come to claim you for our own again.

Oldest Spur Firm's Anniversary Sale

The Spur Hardware & Furniture Company will open their big anniversary sale November 1st which is next Tuesday. This has been a custom of this store since its establishment and the purpose is just to celebrate the opening day and give the people some fine bargains in hardware, as they did that first day back in 1909. Hill Perry, the senior member of the firm, has been with this business in Spur for eighteen years.

The business started under very crude conditions at the opening of the town and by history is considered the oldest business in Spur. However it has this record by only a very short time—probably less than twenty-four hours—but it seems to have made the first sale of any business in Spur. There was such a demand in the town for hardware that the business was started before there was any roof on the building or floor in it. The merchandise was stacked on the ground and sold to the customers as they came in.

Mr. Perry says he does not remember who the first customer was, or what the first sale consisted of, but he thinks it was a keg of nails. He stated that they sold out the entire stock of hardware the first day and had to order more merchandise before he could supply the needs of his customers. He said: "I doubt if we do that well next Tuesday, for our stock is many times larger now and the demand is not so great."

The business has grown greatly and is now housed in a fine brick building with an excellent brick warehouse at the rear and is a store that any town would be glad to have.

Cooking Chats with 6 Famous Cooks

(Courtesy of the Domestic Science Department, Perfection Stove Company)

SALADS SPARE THE COOK IN HOT WEATHER

(Editor's Note: You'll get many hot weather cooking tips from this article, one of a series which 6 famous cooks are contributing to this paper.)

Of course we're hungry, even though the weather is hot! But we don't need the heavy foods so essential on cooler days. And there is no reason for any woman to wear herself out in the summertime, laboring over the stove.

Spare Yourself

Do as much of the preparation and cooking as possible in the early morning hours. If you must bake, do it just once a week. Don't light the oven every day.

And remember that salads, dainty or substantial, are a boon to cooks during hot weather.

Mrs. Kate Brew Vaughn, director of household economics, Los Angeles Evening Express, suggests a simple cabbage and a carrot salad.

Use Cabbage and Carrots

Grate three raw carrots. Chop enough cabbage to make one cup. Chop one pimento and green pepper. Mix these ingredients with mayonnaise and put in icebox to chill. Serve on lettuce leaves.

If preferred this salad may be served with French dressing.

With Cranberries

This is a cooling dish—cranberry salad. Here's Mrs. Vaughn's own recipe.

- 1 pound cranberries
- 2 tablespoons gelatine
- 2 cups sugar
- 1/2 cup water
- 1 tablespoon lemon juice
- 1 cup nut meats
- 1 cup celery
- 1 cup mayonnaise

Boil sugar and water, add cranberries and boil until they pop. Add gelatine, softened in 2 tablespoons water. Cool and add lemon juice, nut meats and celery. Mold or serve in spoonfuls on lettuce leaf with sweet mayonnaise.

There is a big hot weather advantage in cooking with oil. You use only as many burners as are absolutely necessary. Then, too, in the best oil stoves the burners come in a row. There is no reaching across a hot fire.

Two Fruits

Another simple salad, suggested by Miss Margaret Allen Hall, nutrition specialist at the Battle Creek College of Home Economics, is made of dates and apples.

- 2 cups diced apples
- 1 cup cut dates
- 1/2 cup Golden Dressing

Peel the apples and cut into one-half inch cubes. Marinate with the juice of a lemon to prevent discoloration. Put the dates into cold water. Remove the stones and cut each date into about four pieces. Pour boiling water over them. Chill thoroughly. Mix apples and dates and stir in the Golden Dressing. Garnish with lettuce or nasturtium leaves.

Golden Dressing

- 1/2 cup pineapple, apple or other light colored fruit juice
- 1/2 cup lemon juice
- 1/2 cup sugar
- 2 eggs

Beat the eggs sufficiently to blend the yolk and the white, but not until foamy. Add the juice and the sugar. Cook in a double boiler, stirring constantly until thickened. Set in cold water to cool.

One of the biggest advantages of cooking with an oil stove is the fact that it can be moved to the coolest spot. Cook on the back porch, the summer kitchen, wherever it's most convenient. No ties or piping to connect. Take the stove wherever you want it.

Lettuce and Bacon

Boiled or mashed potatoes, with "wilted" lettuce, or lettuce salad with bacon dressing, make a good luncheon with a dessert and beverage.

This is the recipe used by Miss Lucy G. Allen, head of the Boston School of Cookery.

Wash lettuce and set away to chill. At lunch time make the bacon dressing. Dice four or five very thin slices of bacon and fry until crisp. Mix one-half teaspoonful mustard, one teaspoonful sugar, and add to one egg slightly beaten.

Then add one-third cup of vinegar which should be very weak. (Too strong vinegar will coagulate the egg and give a curdled appearance to the dressing.) Pour this into the pan containing bacon and fat. Have a low flame and stir rapidly until the mixture is the consistency of heavy cream. Pour over lettuce.

Make Your Own Combinations

Instead of warming up leftover meats, dice and combine with cold cubed potatoes, peas and mild dressing. This makes a luncheon dish in itself. Other combinations will no doubt occur to you.

The second annual district convention of the new Trans-Canadian District of the West Texas Chamber of Commerce will meet at Spearman in 1928. 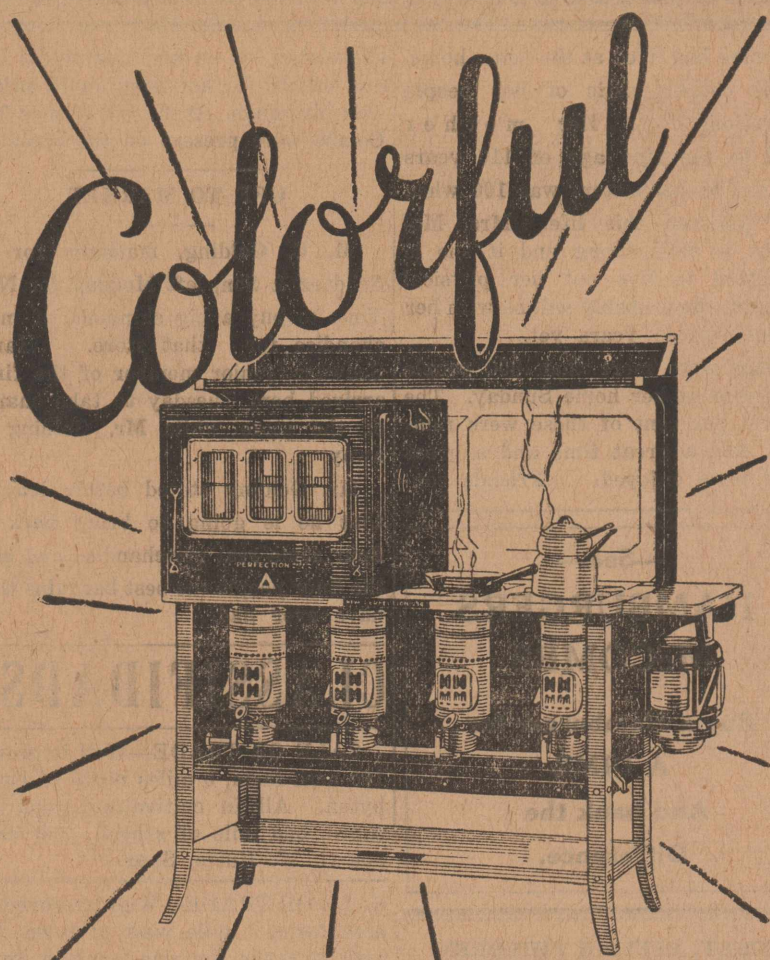
