The Commissioners stated that they would be glad to designate this road if the counties through which the proposed road would run would pay 50 per cent of the cost of the permanent Improvement.

Although dirt roads in this part of the State are not so hard to keep up and the cost probably lower than in the East and South, still the Highway commission looks with disfavor upon this type of road and is following to the letter a rule not to encourage anything but permanent paying.

To quote one of the Commissioners: "It is our intention never to accept another dirt road and to discontinue maintenance on some of the roads we have already accepted if the counties do not provide for the payment of their share of permanent improvements."

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



FIRST AIR SHIPMENT OF WILD ANIMALS HERE FROM EUROPE

ANIMALS HERE FROM EUROPE

Interesting new instances of transportation by air are brought to attention constantly. The first consignment of birds and mammals sent here from abroad by airship arrived on the Graf Zeppelin on August 4. Like any other importations of birds and mammals, this shipment had to undergo Federal inspection by the Biological Survey of the United states Department of Agriculture before receiving a permit to enter the United States. The survey is charged with the duty of preventing the possible entrance of injurious species of birds and animals, and permits to bring in wild anmas or birds are issued by that bureau. This shipment, which was brought from Friedrichshafen, Germany, to Lakehurst, N. J., included 600 canaries, 1 gorilla, and 1 chimpanzee.



Is Handled "Naked."

The silver is handled "naked," with no covering around the bars. Handlers are careful not to rub them against each other and, although the metal in its pure state is comparatively soft, the loss from, scratching in shipment averages but five ounces in every \$3.35 pounds. Before the war London was the great silver builton market. Now New York has usurped the place, principally because the loss of silver has become so much more extensive.

AVIATION SPURS MAPPING PROJECTS

Survey of Unsettled Areas Is Urged.

Doctor Boyle, one of three delegates from the United States to the first meeting of the newly organized Institute, was designated by the National Geographic society, He is chief of the division of geodesy of the United States coust and Geodetic survey and a world famous authority on, loss-tasy.

Charting Potential Resources.

Maps which give precise locations, elevations, and other topographic information constitute the framework of further surveys of forest, mineral, plant, animal, water power and other forms of potential wealth, the speaker explained.

"Therefore the engineers and other leaders in industry are making their wants hnown in regard for topographic mapping." he conditioned. "It has try and the matter and the surveying and manging. Thus are avoided wasteful mistakes of the past in road building and railway construction by routes which are circultions and in areas which have not the latent resources or are too far from markets to be profitable.

A major program of the institute is the co-ordination of topographic surveys already made independently; and stimulation of mapmaking programs. Another important demand for mapping of hitherto unexplored areas arises from the counterful affects which know neither the lighway nor the steel rail.

Doctor Bywie concluded with a resume of the expeditions sent out for the past quarter of a century by the National Geographic society, showing how the society's numerous explorations have added a remarkable variety of data to our knowledge of the world in which we live.


