To Our Customers In Spur:

The testimony on the trial in the Federal Court at Lubbock shows that a meeting was held in the basement of Bryant-Link Company store on the 4th or 5th day of September, 1928, at which 30 or 35 citizens of Spur were present, the object of which is disclosed by the testimony of Geo. S. Link as follows:

"Q. You asked the people to sign up a contract with the city exclusively for a period of five years?"

"A. Yes, sir.

"Q. Was that discussed at that meeting that it would be an exclusive contract and that they would not deal with the West Texas Utilities Company?"

"A. It was understood that they would take the city's light exclusively. "We citizens figured that the West Texas Utilities Company would make a price so low we could n o t compete with them without we made arrangement with the people that they would use the light."

WERE YOU ONE OF THE 30 OR 35 CITIZENS PRESENT AT SUCH MEETING IN THE BASE-MENT OF BRYANT-LINK STORE ON THE NIGHT OF THE 4TH OR 5TH OF SEPTEMBER, 1928?

Were you invited to that meeting?

--Were you consulted on the propriety of putting in a so-called city plant?

Are you in sympathy with the program to take electricity from the so-called city plant exclusively because you would not want to take it from the West Texas Utilities at a lesser price? Is there any possibility that these payments can be met? Even though title remains in the engine company it is arranged that the city pays the insurance and all expenses connected therewith, including the assumption of any liability or damage suits that may arise against the operation of the plant. One act of negligence or misjudgment on the part of the city officials or employes in the operation of this plant may cripple the finances of the city for a number of years.

Is it your idea of loyalty that you should pay through the city more for electricity than you would have to pay the West Texas Utilities Company over a period of years?

Do you consider it loyalty and economy to pay more for what you get because you buy it from the city

"Q. And not take it from the West Texas Utilities Company?"

"A. That was my understanding when I signed it."

The reason is disclosed by the following testimony of Geo. S. Link on the trial, viz: It seems much is being said about loyalty to the city plant. Is the plant in fact a city plant?

The title is reserved by the seller until the city pays for the plant, with interest, from revenues which arise from rates charged you. while the city uses funds from its water revenues to purchase a site and construct a building to operate and furnish you light from tax-free equipment at a greater price?

Would you attempt to drive out of Spur one of the largest tax-payers and lose the revenue derived by taxation while the city plant is not taxable.
