

Commenting on the \$5 that one an Saba pecan brought its grower, the Denton Record-Chronicle emarks: "The pecan industry in Texas is growing and within the ext decade pecans will be one of he important crops of the state." The nut is giving economic indeendence to an increasing numper of Texans.

I. L. Crawford of Argyle, who has been growing honey-ball melons for several years and who says the crop will "make more money than anything else I can plant," will put in eleven acres to the crop the coming year. The honeyball is a cross between the cantaoupe and the honey dew and is unusually well flavored.

The Southwestern Gas & Electric Co., headquarters Texarkana, 📓 serving a thriving section of East Texas, will spend \$4,000,000 in improvements in 1930 according to recent announcement. Major improvements are to be made at Texarkana, Marshall and Longview.

Stephenville, which shipped approximately half that amount for the Thanksgiving market, expects to ship close to a half million pounds of dressed turkeys this season. The Erath turkey crop is valued at well above \$200,000.
