In speaking of events Mrs. Haile said that her maiden name was Miss Mary B. Hodges and that she born in Tennessee April 29, 1848. She came to Texas in 1853 and settled with her parents in Grayson County about eight miles north of Whitesboro. She stated that she attended which in Whitesboro and at one time school in Whitesboro and at one time counted the houses of the town which numbered 48. The town was named from A. B. White who was among the first business men in the community.
She quit school at Whitesboro in 1865
when the soldiers of the Civil War began returning home. She stated that her father and four brothers were in

the Confederate Army.

In speaking of the Civil War days she said that her family carded, spun and wove all the cloth that was used by the family for clothing, bed clothes, etc. and they made all the yarn and knitted all the socks and stockings that the family used. All the work was done by hand as there was no sew ing machine. She said the first sewing machine she ever saw was in Cooke County and she was the mother of three children at that time. In speaking of fine dresses she said that the first dress she ever had after the Civil War made from factory cloth was when she was twenty years of age. She then related of how the boys under 18 years of age had to fight off the Confederate Army. She related of how her father after the Civil war fought the Indians and of the

perilous days they had to endure. She said she had lived a frontier life. She moved to Montague County and lived at Bowie before the railroad was built there. Later her father moved to Throckmorton County and was ving there when the drought of 1886 She said friends from Bowie tried to induce her father to return east and went to Throckmorton with eams to take his belongings, but he

refused to go.

She related an amusing incident of Civil War days. She said that a woman of the eastern states was being per secuted by the Union soldiers. Her husband was in the Southern Army an dshe saw the Union soldiers were going to destroy everything she had. So the woman collected some things and started for Texas on a horse. She had secured several bolts of cloth in-cluding calico. Mrs. Haile stated that she had a girl chum who traded this voman a cow and calf for ten yard

woman a cow and calf for ten yards of calico to make a new dress. She said that a new calico dress in those days was the peak of fashion.

Mrs. Haile said she was married to T. J. Haile January 10, 1867. There were eleven children born into the home, nine of whom are still living. They are G. C. Haile of Megargle, W. B. Haile of Clarendon, J. W. Haile of Selma, Calif., Mrs. Mary T. Sampson


