where in the world. The Texas Planning Board is consistently where in the world. The Texas planning Board is consistenty native to the State; this agency has done some valuable work in this connection in the past, and it is continuing its efforts.
Coupling this with the natural resources exhibit to Coupling this with the natural resources exhibit to be shown
at the Centennial Exposition, it is not unlikely that we shall see in the near future begining being made of the development of a Texas stone industry. For such development is sure to follow
