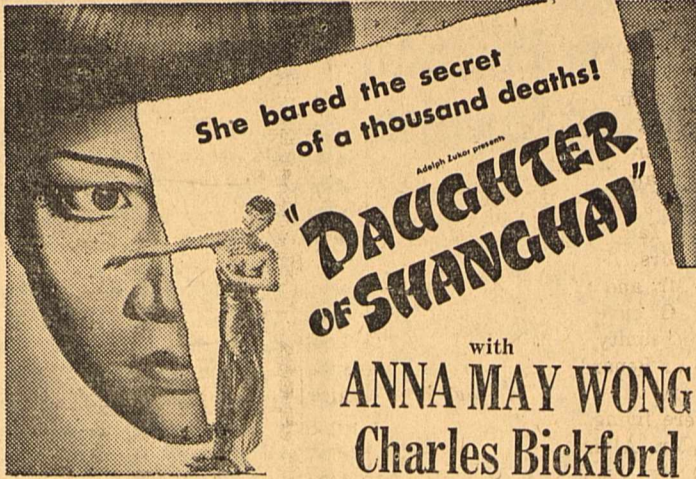

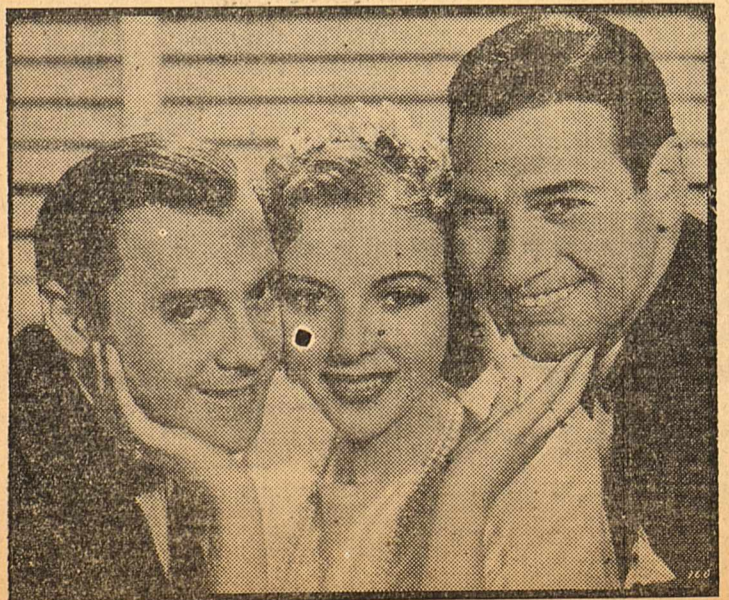

**Financial Statement Made By Santa Fe**

The Santa Fe Railway's net operating income for November was \$1,152,855, according to a statement released yesterday by President Samuel T. Bledsoe. This is a decrease of \$1,544,483 under November of last year.

Gross for the System Lines was \$14,008,011, a decrease under November 1936, of \$558,356 or 3.83 per cent. Operating expenses were \$11,584,004, an increase of \$968,033, or 9.12 per cent over the same month of 1936.

Of the increase in operating expenses, \$468,489 was on account of maintenance of way and structures and equipment, and \$499,544 on account of transportation and miscellaneous expenses.

Railway tax accruals were \$1,239,856, a decrease for the month of \$82,675 or 6.25 per cent. Accruals under the carrier's taxing Social Security Acts for the month were \$337,235.

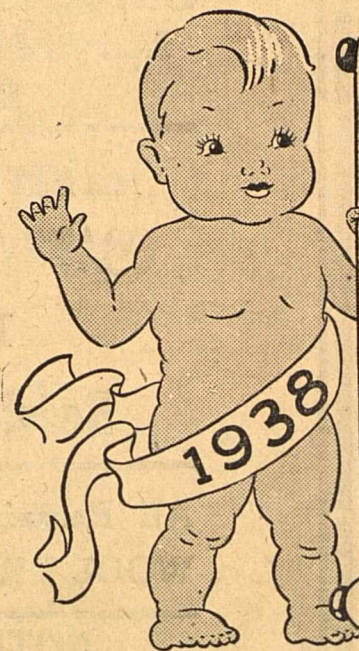
