Is Law Becoming 'Substitute Religion'?

By GEORGE CORNELL

NEW YORK (AP) - Uneasiness has developed among some legal scholars at a modern approach to "the law" that cuts jurisprudence off from its moral-religious roots.

The effect as they see it is a kind of cut-flower legalism, deprived of its nuturing sources and philosophical depth, yet exalted in present times as a substitute "religion" itself.

- As a result, education in the law in this country has suffered the loss of a vital dimension, two noted legal scholars told a meeting in San Francisco of the Association of American Law

Harold J. Berman, a Harvard University professor of law, said the scope of scholarship in the field has been reduced by "the neglect of the sources of the law in the canons and transcendent beliefs of religion." The resultant shallowness

tends toward "studying cases

At the same time, he said, "secularization of legal education has led to idolizing of the law itself." Berman, who is Jewish, added: "Pursuit of the law's objective of social justice, without any sense of dependence upon God, has pro-duced a kind of utopianism which has also become a reli-

John T. Noonan Jr., a Catholic of the University of California's Law School, cited the

"There is a virtual search for salvation in the law by people coming to law schools today."

In a similar vein but in another setting, U.S. Supreme Court Justice Harry Blackmun declared: "The balance has been missing. The compass has been askew. It seems the old guideposts are no longer there, or at least no longer looked to or relied upon."

At a lecture at Emory University Law School in Atlanta, Justice Blackmun, a United Methodist layman, called for a restoration of basic moral and ethical principles in the nation, particularly in the legal profes-

Citing recent Watergate-related scandals and other cases in which lawyers compromised ethical principles, he said the legal profession must be committed to "what is just and moral as well as barely legal."

New Tariff Politics: Reversed Situation

WASHINGTON (KFS) - Those unfamiliar with previous U.S. tariff struggles may not appreciate the political irony that now sees New England leading the fight to block or invalidate the Ford Administration's oil tariffs.

The purpose of the levy is to raise imported oil prices, decrease U.S. consumption, encourage increased domestic petroleum production, and make the U.S. more self-sufficient in energy.

No one can blame the New Englanders for complaining about tariffs that will increase Northeastern oil costs while comforting the petroleum industries of Ohio, Wyoming, Mississippi, Texas, California, Alaska et al. But the administration's rationale rests on the national interest - the goal of increased petroleum self-sufficiency - and not on favoring or penalizing any particular

Ironically, New England should know the logic of tariffs much better than other sections. For more than a century, from the rise of Alexander Hamilton to the decline of Herbert Hoover, the tariff issue was one of the great inflammations of U.S. politics. As late as the early 1900's, tariffs on foreign goods averaged 40 per cent and the federal government derived a major part

> Today, the situation is reversed. New England politicians allege that the oil tarrif would be unfair, a ransfer of money to the petroleum interests. But even this is not clear. Late in 1974, Walter Peirson, president of Amoco Oil, made a speech in Washington charging that the regulations governing the production of petroleum have subsidized New England at the expense of consumers in other parts of the country, and he attributed some of the responsibility to the power of the New England congressional delegation! Apparently, there are two sides to ever story.

The Washington Merry-Go-Round

WASHINGTON - H. L. Hunt, the eccentric oil billionaire, kept a tight lock during his life on a Pandora's box. When he died a few weeks ago at age 85, the lid was lifted for us. What we found, attested to in a suppressed court document, is an incredible tale of bribery, infidelity, -corruption, tax cheating, political manipulation and

The charges were brought by two of the old tycoon's closest associates his former personal assistant, John Curington, and trusted corporate aide John Brown.

allegedly siphoning off funds from the Hunt empire. But their charges, made jointly under oath, shouldn't be dismissed without an investigation.

Haroldsor Lafavette Hunt was a crusty curmudgeon, who liked to boast he was "the richest man in the world" but who had a reputation as a skinflint. He packed his lunch to his office in a brown paper sack and spread whole wheat sandwiches and dried prunes on his desk, using the Wall Street Journal

But the secret life of the oil billionaire, according to Curington and Brown, was a different story. They portray him as a big-stakes gambler who squandered money to gratify his hates. Among his victims were some the biggest names in American

The story was buried in the legal filings of a 1970 lawsuit. After Curington and Brown made their charges, the suit was settled and the sworn statements were withdrawn. But we have obtained copies of the suppressed material.
