DENVER CITY. Tex. (AP)-Nine persons trying frantically to outrun death almost made it as leaking gas from an oil well stalked through the fog and drizzle to kill them.

Tom Merrill, who saw death coming, gathered his wife and two sons and miraculously escaped.

Eight of the dead were found outside a residence Sunday morning about 50 yards from the Merrill home and 200 yards from the leaking wellhead. The ninth victim, an oil field worker sent to investigate the leak, was found in his pickup truck.







WASHINGTON - When Gerald Ford tried to impeach Supreme Court Justice William O. Douglas five years ago, Ford used secret data that had been slipped to him from the files of the FBI and probably the CIA.

Ford was then the House Republican leader, a loyal party man, who, sometimes played a rough game of politics.

In 1969, President Nixon wanted to clean the liberals out of the Supreme Court so he could appoint conservatives in their places. With this in mind, his friend Ford began a campaign to get peachment hearings going against Douglas.

For ammunition, Ford went to John Mitchell, who was then the attorney against Douglas came out of FBI files. general. Mitchell agreed to put someone in contact with Ford.

WASHINGTON - Although a final decision in the great war of politics between President Ford and the huge Democratic majority in Congress is far distant, Democrats in the House have now handed the President a lethal weapon to be used against themselves with potentially damaging effects.

Indeed, the controlling Democrats overrode some of their own best political strategists and unwittingly played into Mr. Ford's hands when they insisted on linking their 90-day ban on higher oil tariffs to the bill raising the debt ceiling.

When that bill gets to the President's desk, as seems highly probable, Mr. Ford now plans to veto it, perhaps with fireside chat accusing the divided. uncertain and leaderless Democrats of playing politics with the energy crisis, the nation's worst dilemma since the Great Depression. Without a higher debt ceiling, he will paint the grim picture of payless paydays for government workers, the threat of default on government bonds and the specter of military and foreign commitments threatened by partisan politics.


The second probable result, and far more important to Mr. Ford: an opening round political victory of major magnitude depicting him as an activist leader pitted against a politics-as-usual congressional majority employing parliamentary tactics to shackle his freedom to act, at the same time unable to produce a competing energy plan of its own.

The trap into which the congressional Democrats may now have fallen was carefully-and secretly-laid by a handful of Republican members of the House Ways and Means Committee, led by Rep. Herman Schneebeli of Pennsylvania, the panel's senior Republican.

Schneebeli, with the connivance of the White House, simply "neglected" to vote four Republican proxies in the crucial, cliff - hanging 15-14 committee vote last week. That vote attached the 90-day ban on higher oil import fees (due to start next Saturday at \$1 a barrel) to the debt ceiling bill. If voted, those four proxies would have defeated the move by the committee's liberal Democratic majority, over the opposition of chairman Al Ullman of Oregon, to use the debt ceiling bill as a Christman tree and force him to sign it into law with the ban on higher oil tariffs.

This Democratic strategy, devised by committee liberals, is based on the rising national clamor against Mr. Ford's approach to the energy crisis: reduce the consumption of fuel by raising its price across the board, including homeheating fuels, instead of concentrating on the vast waste of gasoline. What makes the strategy dubious is not its underlying political truth, which even Ford energy strategists privately agree on, but the transparent political tactic of unfairly forcing the President's hand.

SACRAMENTO - There's great stirring here over the fierce pace set by the new governor as he works to bring his New Spirit to this nation-state. Will he make it?

Jerry Brown's mind spins constantly. He runs his staff past midnight. Restless and energetic, this heretical young man is the most exciting governor in the republic at this point.

Much of what he says and promises runs counter to the irrational, routine liberalism here, practiced by rote, and ultimately rejected by the citizenry. Still, Brown wears the liberal stripe in urging new departures.*.**

He insists he is ready to make generous compromises with the Democratic majority. But first, he says, the Democrats have to know exactly what they are for, not what they are against, and they have not begun to tell him because they don't know.

A confidential letter from Sen. Hubert Humphrey to House Speaker Carl Albert last month conveyed just such a warning about the political dangers of the huge Democratic majority having no economic or energy program.

"We simply must have someone who can call the shots and give a sense of direction," Humphrey wrote Albert. "There is no single congressional Democratic leadership program to which the public can point or on which : we can place our emphasis . . . 



Bill Would End Dorm Living Rule

AUSTIN - College students 18 years of age and older won't have to live in dormitories any nore if legislation by Rep. Jim Mattox of Dallas passes. Many state colleges and aniversities require students inder a certain age, usually 21, to live in on-campus housing. Mattox's bill would change his so that only students under 18 may be compelled to live in a dormitory. Persons 18 and older are adults under the law.

The Flight Service Center at the El Paso International Airport said no flight plan had been filed by the aircraft. A supervisor at the center said a telephone query from "the Den-ver area" had been made about the downed plane.

Locater Transmitter The aircraft was located through an emergency locater transmitter operated manually by one of the victims.

Although the plane's point of Wigin and its destination were hot released by the military, the plane appeared to be headed in a southerly direction. One helicopter, crewman said

the Beechcraft crashed in a mountainous area and apparrently veered at the last moment in an attempt to avoid collision with a mountainside. First Lt. Rachel Martinez at Beaumont Medical Center said immigration and narcotics offi-
