

### Proposal Sent To Senators

AUSTIN (AP)-The House passed and sent to the Senate today an \$80 million emergency relief bill for the state's inflation-strained public school districts. The vote was 136-4.

Senators passed their own virtually identical version of the bill Wednesday, but the two houses must get together on a single measure before the school districts can get their money.

Legislators completed action on a constitutional amendment authorizing higher pensions for retired school teachers. Voters will make the final decision at an April 22 special election.

House members approved the measure 133-1, and the Senate finished work on it by voting 30-0 to accept a House change shifting the election date from April 5 to April 22.

Awaiting House action next week is a teacher retirement bill, increasing pensions from 5 to 18 per cent and costing \$98 million in general revenue, contingent upon final approval of the constitutional amendment

### **Key Provision**

The key provision of the amendment raises from 6 per cent to 10 per cent the amount of total teacher compensation that the state can match as its contribution to the retirement fund. The same provision also applies to the state employes retirement system. Also, the state would not be limited to dollar-for-dollar matching of teacher contributions but could put in a larger amount up to the 10 per cent limit.

In an emergency, as determined by the governor, the legislature could appropriate even more to either retirement system as required to fund benefits authorized by the lawmak-

## **Urban Crime Rate** Is Soaring Again

WASHINGTON (KFS) - A prediction: The law-and-order issue is on the tracks again, building up steam to roar back into American politics with the


comph of one of yesteryear's big eight Skeptics need only watch the way in which unemployment and crime are

moving up together. After levelling off from 1970-73, the urban crime rate is soaring again. Detroit's surge can be chalked up partly to the city's huge, special auto-related unemployment. But the trend is almost as bad in other major cities. In Ohio, a menswear manufacturer has begun producing tailored bulletproof jackets and vests of "Kevlar," a super-tough fiber said to stop knives and 80 to 90 per cent of handgun assaults. Before long, big-city residents may need them.

Consider the situation in Chicago. Although joblessness is a bit below the national average, the crime rate has climbed sharply since unemployment began spreading in September. Fourth quarter 1974 murders were 61 per cent above figures for the same period in 1973. Fourth quarter 1974 robberies were up 55 per cent. About the same time, the school

feel that crime follows the business cycle, and now is rising with unemployment. Inflation adds to economic pressure. Other experts mention the dangerous age profile of the slums - the birthrate of the 1950s has swollen the crime-prone 15-25 age bracket. Then there is the impact of television violence which makes crime seem stylish and death uneventful in a plastic sort of way.

Although unemployment is doubtless a major contributory factor. I can't buy it as the basic explanation. First of all, most criminals are chronically unemployed; they are not people driven to crime by losing their job. Secondly, while the 1930s showed some upsurge in crime, there is just no comparison. Books about the depression contain relatively few references to the crime rate. Our big cities had more crime in 1966, when the national unemployment rate was under 4 per cent, than they did in 1933, when unemployment was at 25 per cent!

A better explanation probably lies in the disintegration of urban culture that has taken place over the last 40 years. Since Roosevelt's days, black migrations from the South have poured into Northern inner cities. Millions of illegal aliens have come in the last decade. Unemployment is high, reaching 30 to 40 per cent among ghetto youngsters. For many families, welfare is a way of life. Spreading joblessness is icing the cake of despair, and increasingly inflammatory television violence is adding a dangerous catalyst that did not exist in 1933.

All of the factors probably responsible for the late 1974 upsurge are expected to get worse as 1975 progresses.

a facade of respectability. Communist leaders made no secret of hopes to be invited to join Mrs. Peron's cabinet.

But as soon as Peron recognized that his long-trusted aid, Campora, was not as tractable as had been thought, that he considered himself much more than a puppet of Peron, Campora was asked to resign and a caretaker government was installed. When the general succumbed to a combination of overwork and multiple ailments July 1, 1973, Mrs. Peron assumed the presidency.

But, the resurgence of Marxist-led terrorism tipped the scales against the leftists, they lost their influence in Mrs. Peron's cabinet, and the government launched a full-fledged campaign against extremists of the left.

against the Peruvian dictatorship. Ecuador's dictatorship recently decreed a law against terrorism.
