Fed Credit System Now Under Attack

NEW YORK (AP) - Arthur F. Burns, the Federal Reserve Board chairman, maintains that allocation of credit by the Fed could wreck the economy. Some critics maintain that the failure to allocate already has.

Burns long has been in the position of protecting what he considers to be the purity of the Fed, the nation's central bank. from political taint. The Fed, he feels, must be above such considerations.

His critics insist that social desirability should be a criterion in granting credit. Without such a guideline, they say, credit simply goes to the highest bidder - often for an inflationary, speculative or nonessential use.

A challenge to the existing technique of dispensing credit to whoever bids the highest is now being made in Congress, by Democrats mainly, who feel credit over the past few years has been channeled in the wrong direction.

Housing, they say, is the most obvious illustration.

Whereas potential homebuyers couldn't afford the high rates of interest in the past few years - and in many states usury laws prevented loans from being made at all — business could, albeit reluctantly.

With homebuyers lacking the ability to compete with various types of businesses that can afford 10 per cent or more, wouldn't it have been better to allocate?

It would be impossible, Burns told a House Banking subcommittee, to devise a leak-proof program of controls. "The ones who would probably suffer most are small businesses and homebuyers," he said.

Burns and others opposed to allocations, which would seem to mean most of the banking community, might have some points on their side, but the subject is bound to be thrashed about if not out, in Congress, in panking conventions, in public

ASIA MEMO-Dr. Nagai Studied And Taught In U.S.

There has never been a Japanese cabinet minister so conversant with American life as that country's present minister of education, Dr. Michio Nagai.

Nagai, 52, has been both a student and teacher at American universities.

Nagai wrote a scorching evaluation of the Japanese education system a few years ago and continued to write authoritatively on education and other social and foreign policy issues in recent years as a member of the editorial board of Asahi Shimbun, Japan's largest and most prestigious newspaper.

This background made Nagai an obvious choice for the education portfolio in the cabinet of Prime Minister Takeo Miki, who has stated that close relations with the United States is the major element of Japanese foreign policy.

Nagai's knowledge and "feel" for the United States should not be confused with blind adulation of this country's institutions. As director of the Communications Institute, East-West Center, Hawaii, in 1972-73, for example, Nagai became thoroughly disenchanted with U.S.-style bureaucracy.

Whether he will find Japanese-style governmental bureaucracy any easier to cope with remains to be seen.

During a farewell party for Nagai at one of Honolulu's Japanese-style restaurants in the spring of 1973, he made some incisive comments about the East-West Center:

Wouldn't it be a good idea to have Asian languages used in some course instruction, rather than always English? Shouldn't more of the East-West Center's programs be held on the U.S. mainland? After all. Hawaii is not any more representative of the United States than Okinawa would be of Japan.

After graduation from Kyoto University in 1944, Nagai received Japanese postwar passport No. 3 and enrolled at Ohio State University in 1949, where he received his Ph.D. in 1953. He returned to Kyoto University as

an assistant professor (1954-58) and then became a professor at the Tokyo Institute of Technology (1958-70). He taught at Columbia University in 1959, University of California in 1965 and Stanford University in 1967. In 1972 he was given a leave of

absence from the Asahi Shimbun to take the job at the East-West Center.

Did President Nixon Restrain Kissinger? WASHINGTON - We must all wish Secretary of State Henry Kissinger well

as he tries to spur peace negotiations in the Middle East. But in the interest of clearing the record, we might also o review the State Department's denial of Charles Colson's statement that Kissinger was eager to bomb Hanoi in December, 1972. Again, we are treated to Kissinger's marvelous ambiguity. Colson, on national television, said

recently that, in December, 1972, he saw a cable from Kissinger referring to the breakdown of negotiations with the North Vietnamese, which read: "Start the bombing immediately. These madmen have double-crossed us."

Colson also claimed that President Nixon, one year later, remembered the cable and remarked that Kissinger "really is unstable at times." Well, naturally, Kissinger is furious

over this. He told newsmen he wouldn't "dignify" the Colson remarks with a comment. A State Department spokesman announced that "the record does not support any part of Mr. Colson's Well, of course it doesn't. Kissinger

was director of the National Security

Council, not secretary of state, at the time. Moreover, the easiest way to ascertain the veracity of Colson's remarks is for the White House to produce the tapes and records of conversations and cables between Nixon and Kissinger. Thus he cleverly remarked, on tv, that the December bombing of Hanoi was "the most painful, most difficult and most lonely" decision that Nixon had to make and that "one does not become President of the United States by having a weak

Market Continues To Ignore World Around It

By CHET CURRIER

NEW YORK (AP) - With its booming rally since the start of the year, the stock market has once again demonstrated a seemingly illogical ability to ig-nore the world around it.

Unemployment is at its highest level since World War II. Inflation may have slackened a bit, but it's still a painful force. The effects of the recession are spreading from industry to in-

And the outlook for corporate profits - traditionally the most tangible factor to which stock prices relate — is cloudy at best for at least the first half of this year.

But investors who shunned stocks during the comparatively rosy days of 1973 and early 1974, when many companies were reporting huge profit gains, now are suddenly buying them at a record-breakOn Tuesday, the rally that began New Year's Eve touched a new peak as volume reached 35.16 million shares, over three million more than had ever been traded in a single session. The Dow Jones average of 30 industrials closed up 11.89 at 726.92 — nearly 150 points above its December low.

The standard explanation for the divergence of the stock market and the current state of the economy is actually very

As the late Gerald M. Loeb, longtime market expert and investment writer, put it in an observation quoted in the Hirsch Organization's Stock Trader's Almanac: "Stocks are bought on expectations, not

"The market is quite frequently a very logical thing," says Raymond F. DeVoe Jr. of Wall Street's Spencer, Trask & Co. "It's just

that it looks three to six months ahead rather than at immediate prospects.

"The current recession which is the worst since 1937-38 was reflected in the market's drop to a 12-year low last fall. Now the market is saying that recovery is ahead and we aren't going to have anything worse than a recession. Armageddon will be a little late this year.

"So it's quite normal for the market to be rising while the economy is slumping. In the past in situations like this, by the time the economy actually turns around the market is already out of sight."

The whole business isn't quite as simple as that, unfortunate ly. If it were, legions of Wall Street analysts wouldn't have to struggle a good many times without success trying to gauge what the market is going to do





species are to change fish habitat from streams and rivers to lakes and reservoirs. Most Texas fish, including the largemouth bass, are not particularly suited to the open water habitat found in Texas' large reservoirs.

Rough Fish Problem

When a reservoir is built and stocked, it experiences a period of excellent fishing before the balance of rough fish and game fish becomes disproportionate in favor of rough fish.

The new species introduced in these lakes are better suited to a big lake environment, and they give anglers an added variety of fishing.

The new species also prey on the rough fish, and this is the second reason for stocking them. Northern pike and striped bass have the potential of much greater size than most native fish, so they are able to take on more and bigger rough fish.

Striped bass are especially attractive to biologists because they are more likely to go after the schools of gizzard shad which are largely ignored by largemouth bass. Different Approaches

As experienced fishermen know, different species of fish require different angling methods, although some of the techniques used are common for catching more familiar

The following techniques could help anglers develop the necessary skills for catching the new species.

Walleye - Northern fishermen have found that some locations pay off better than others when they are searching for walleye. These best spots include gravel banks, brush piles, weed beds and rock riprap on dams and embankments.

Jigging seems to be one of the most productive methods for catching walleye but experts say the retrieve is important and no one method is consistent. So they recommend that if one retrieve isn't producing, such as a steady
