# TIA Slates 100 Layoffs

HOUSTON (AP) - Texas International Airlines says "increasing financial losses" incurred in an almost three-month old strike has caused to firm to lay off 100 of its 400 employes. Jim O'Donnell, a spokesman for the Houston-based airline,

said Monday, "Pessimism about prospects for resolving the strike which began in early December added to the decision to lay off the employees.

Effective Friday He said the furloughs are effective Friday

Some 1,100 ground employes, members of the Air Line Employees Association, struck the airline Dec. 1.

The airline continued to serve most of its routes until Dec. 5 when members of the Airlines Pilots Association began honoring picket lines. All flights were

then cancelled. The airline served some 50 cities in nine states and Mexico when the strike was called.

Wages are not the primary issues in the disputes, company and union official claim. The main issues, they said, involved parttime employes, split shifts and a 71/2-hour work day.

Considered Earlier Robert Gallaway, vice president of the airline, said management considered laying off the 100 employes in December.

However, he said the company decided to implement "a program of salary cuts ... for all 400 employes as a way of avoiding the furlough of this group."

"But after nearly 90 days we cannot afford to maintain a 400-person payroll when so little chance for a limited service resumption exists," Gallaway said.

## Rhetoric Versus Reality In Cairo

By ROWLAND EVANS

CAIRO - The real and pervasive fear of a new war against Israel dominates every aspect of political discussion in Cairo, a fact that makes Israel's use of the key Sinai passes as her most important bargaining chip seem slightly ludicrous.

If the Mitla and Gidda passes did return to Egyptian control, it is true that any future Israeli thrust back to the Suez Canal would be far more costly. But that is not part of Secretary of State Henry Kissinger's formula. He wants Israel to withdraw behind the passes, but definitely not to be replaced by the Egyptian army.

Yet, even if the Egyptians did gain military control of the passes, both Egyptians and other military sources here agree there is no conceivable way that control of the passes would expose Israel proper to any threat from Egypt.

As an offensive force, we were told, the Egyptian army is not capable today of waging war.

Indeed, there is full appreciation of the incontrovertible fact in Israel despite the bloody surprise of the October 1973 war when the Egyptians momentarily ended the long era of Israeli invulnerability by crossing the canal and destroying the Bar-Lev line. ## The Washington Merry-Go-Round

WASHINGTON - The United States has made secret preparations not to seize but to protect the oil fields of the Arab oil sheikhs.

In public, Secretary of State Henry Kissinger has warned that the United States, as a last resort might take military action to prevent the oil strangulation of the West.

But in private, he has offered to help the petroleum potentates defend their fabulous holdings. He is worried that radical Arab groups may attempt to overthrow the conservative sheikhs, who have friendly ties with the United States. This could put the vast oil reserves of the Persian Gulf into hostile

Secret intelligence cables report radical movements in most of the Persian Gulf states. Some of the underground leaders, according to the cables, have spent time in Russia, China and North Korea. There is also evidence that they have received Soviet and Chinese arms.

For example, the strategic sheikhdom of Oman, which guards the entrance to the Persian Gulf, has been threatened by a radical uprising. There have been intelligence reports, too, that guerrillas have attacked Saudi Arabian

This is the reason the United States is bolstering the military forces of Iran. Jordan, Lebanon, Oman and Saudi

The heaviest military support is going to the shah of Iran, whom Kissinger has encouraged to become the protector of the Persian Gulf. Both the United States and Iran have gone to the aid of troubled Oman. The United States has just sent the omar of Oman

The United States also is advising, training and supplying the armed forces of Saudi Arabia. In the past, this military assistance has been largely hidden behind civilian contracts.

We reported on Jan. 6, 1973, for example, that the Bendix Field Engineering Corp. was hiring military experts right off U.S. bases, dressing them in civilian clothes and sending them to Saudi Arabia.

At least three other giant U.S. corporations-Lockheed, Northrop and Raytheon—also have provided military services to Saudi Arabia. Now the Associated Press has discovered another civilian contractor, Vinnell Corp., which has agreed to train the Saudi National Guard to protect oil wells.

This corporate military aid has been coordinated quietly by a U.S. training mission in Saudi Arabia. Its duties go far beyond training and deal with just about every aspect of military affairs, according to our sources.





However, the rate of flu-re-33.3 lated deaths remained above 18.2 the epidemic threshold for the 15.4 sixth consecutive week, Dr. Charles Hoke of the center's flu 18.7 The latest statistics showed 15.8 690 flu-related deaths in 121 major U.S. cities for the week

ending Feb. 15. That is 123 above the "expected number" established by the center's evaluation of flu activity in previous years. However, it is 126 below the peak of 816 deaths reported earlier in he had not received a reply February.
