





Printers' Strike Puts Britons In Dark About New Laws

CARDIFF, Wales — Ignorance of the law is no excuse. And it's no legal defense

This ancient legal dictum still holds true in Britain, where it originated, just as it always has in the United States.

But what do you do if it's impossible to find out what the

Here in Britain this is no longer a theoretical question tossed in on law students' final exams; it actually happened.

Suppose a printers' strike closes down the Government Printing Office in Washington, cutting off the supply of booklets and pamphlets about everything under the sun. This might inconvenience a few people, but mainly it's the stuff of which

Then the Congressional Record no longer appears. So, who cares?

But what happens when the post office begins to run out of stamps? And the supply of forms required for pension checks is melting away? Jokes begin to give way to righteous indignation. Finally, suppose Congress has

passed a whole bunch of important new laws. Due to the strike, none of the millions of people affected know anything about these new rules that they must live by. Nor do the lawyers. Nor even the judges.

The mass media try to help, but they don't have enough time or space to televise or print the tangled verbiage of the new

All this is roughly what hap-

pened here in Britain late last fall when 700 printers at Her Majesty's Stationery Office (HMSO) went on strike.

HMSO is Britain's equivalent to the Government Printing Office, though its publications are even more pervasive than Washington's. The British have even more forms to fill out than we do, and they're all printed by HMSO or one of its many subcontractors.

It didn't take long for the 11-week strike's effects to be felt, as six of HMSO's seven plants closed; one in Scotland has "a different union, which didn't strike.

The government offices began to run out of triplicate forms. Lawyers began to realize that they didn't have the foggiest notion what the 35 new parliamentary acts, which had become the law of the land. were all about.

The 3,000-member British Legal Association warned that the nonavailability of the new laws was "a dangerous con-stitutional issue." "The essential promulgation of new laws has completely broken down." agreed the 28,000-member Law Society's secretary general, with "catastrophic" results.

British law scholars stressed that although the public could not obtain a copy of any of the new laws, nevertheless each person's rights and responsibilities under each new law were precisely the same as if the laws had been printed distributed and publicized in the usual way.

Said one member of Parliament, "This is vicious government in the dark. It is impossible for thousands of lawyers up and down the land to advise their clients."

Ignoring the uproar, the government relied on the timehonored British method of problem-solving, "We'll muddle through." Typewritten and Xeroxed copies of the 35 laws were handed around to judges, who were asked to make the copies available to lawyers who needed them.

One government agency in desperation went into the publishing business itself. It rushed through a handbook printed by a private firm explaining how one new law works. Business and profession al societies quickly followed suit, though admitting that it was too little and too late.

The strike's prime issue was the 700 printers' outrage over the fact that the 55 members of the graphic arts union got to go home a half-hour earlier each day than they did, under terms of the smaller union's separate contract with HMSO.

HMSO management willingly gave in to other union demands but remained adamant in its refusal to let the printers go home early. An HMSO spokesman explained that if it should cut its printers workweek then some 3,500 private printing firms would be forced to follow suit, and some inevitably "would go bust."

Even worse, HMSO said, its printers are classified as "industrial civil servants," and all other government employes in the same category, such as workers at the Mint and at naval dockyards, would expect the same treatment.

The printers temporarily have gone back to work now, with a \$13.80 per week pay hike, but the strike is far from being finally settled. The crucial demand for a shorter workweek is still under negotiation and neither HMSO nor the printers has budged a bit in their posi-

HMSO gradually is whittling away at the massive backlog of unprinted documents. The most important of the 35 new laws held up by the 11-week strike now are on sale at HMSO

retail stores. With the strike still far from being finally settled, the lawyers and law professors are urging the government to see that it never happens again. Unfortunately, though, no one has offered any valid advice on just how to do this.

So what does the person with a little money to invest do? Chances are he will keep his money in his pocket for the time being, at least.

Uncertainty and lack of confidence have a lot to do with the existing investment situation.

But every now and then a note of optimism floats down from the financial centers of the North and East, encouraging the man on the street in West Texas or wherever to reconsider . . . and this is good. In fact, it is just what is needed across the width and breadth of the land. People anxiously are waiting for the "encouraging word," so to

This is why the words of the Wall Street economists to the effect that business has picked up tremendously this year and that the New York Stock Exchange trading volume has reached a number of new highs in recent weeks, are so meaningful.

The trend, it is said, actually picked up steam late last year, giving Wall Street firms and investors a new lease on life.

Looking ahead to the rest of the year . . . well, we can hope, can't we? . . . at least while the market trend is up!

WASHINGTON - Top CIA officials are debating whether to bring legal action against Philip Agee, whose book about his life in the CIA has caused

Agee listed everyone who had worked with him in the CIA in Latin America. He also added names provided, he said, by "a small group of Mexican comrades whom I trained to follow the comings and goings of CIA people before I left Mexico City."

It has cost the CIA "several million" dollars," according to inside sources, to transfer the agents who had been fingered and to protect its operations in Latin America.

The CIA, however, couldn't protect all the local people whom Agee listed as CIA "collaborators." Among them were many who had only routine dealings with the CIA in such legitimate activities as drug control, antihijacking techniques and antiterrorist operations.

A number of them have been harassed with threatening phone calls. One reported that his daughter's life had been threatened and the wall in front of his home had been defaced.

In Uruguay, a taxi driver whose name appeared in Agree's book stopped at a traffic light. Another car pulled alongside him and an assailant emptied a pistol at the taxi. The driver miraculously escaped injury.

In Ecuador, an engineer on Agee's list appeared at the U.S. embassy to plead for protection. Another man, with the same last name as one of the alleged "collaborators," asked the CIA for a letter attesting to the mistaken

El Caribe predicted that the sugar conference in April will bring a confrontation between countries, like Cuba and Mexico, which would like to be able to fix prices artificially, and others, including the Dominican Republic, that would prefer that prices be established by supply and demand.

The reports were interpreted as an indication that Premier Fidel Castro's dictatorship is concerned over its position in the world sugar picture in the future.

Prior to Castro's rise to power in 1959, Cuba was the principal sugar-growing and exporting nation in the Americas. Under the now-expired Sugar Act, Cuba enjoyed a share in the U.S. sugar market that was almost twice the quota of the Dominican Republic, and more than double those of Mexico and Brazil.

But, after Castro began confiscating U.S.-owned properties and relations with the United States were broken, Cuba's quota was parceled out to the other American republics, and most of the beneficiaries expanded their sugar industries considerably.

In the early years of his rule, Castro sought to deemphasize sugar's importance to Cuba. But, in the late 1960s, he reversed himself and now, again, sugar accounts for an estimated 80 per cent of Cuba's exports.

Most of Cuba's sugar exports reportedly go to the Soviet Union and other Communist bloc countries. Still, Castro's envoys claim that it is the dollar proceeds from sales on the world market that pay for the goods Cuba buys from Argentina, Canada, Spain and other non-Communist countries.

While sugar is still being traded at prices double or triple those of a year earlier, there are fears that the price may decline to half of current

Then, were there to be bumper cane harvests in many countries, international sugar price wars might break out.

In accord with this line of thought, if Cuba could do in 1975 what Venezu did in 1960, when the Venezuelans inspired the establishment of the Organization of Petroleum Exporting Countries, a few years hence the sugar exporters might dicate to the world.





Closed Hearts And Minds On Vietnam

By ROWLAND EVANS And ROBERT NOVAK

WASHINGTON - The cancellation, perhaps forever, of the congressional mission to South Vietnam resulted less from crowded legislative schedules, as publicly claimed, than from overwhelming unconcern on Capitol Hill about the fate of Indochina.

Influential members of Congress generally begged off when invited to go. Many Congressmen who did accept are unalterably opposed to continuing U.S. military aid to the Saigon regime, some of them volunteering for the long journey to make sure anti-Saigon sentiment was on the delegation. Although the administration claims the mission will be rescheduled, one high official fears Congressmen would spend so much time "hunting for tiger cages" - that is, seeking to justify propaganda about government repression - that the whole project should be scrapped.

This reflects the congressional mood on Vietnam: Don't bother me with the facts, I've got my mind made up. The hearts and minds of Capitol Hill are closed to the building tragedy of South Vietnamese troops, debilitated by reduced U.S. aid, being ground down by North Vietnamese troops — in flagrant violation of the 1973 Paris ceasefire. Indeed, Congressmen generally shy away from being exposed to facts pointing to them as responsible for the outcome in Viet-

The trip to Vietnam was conceived by a key Pentagon official who on frequent trips to Vietnam was repeatedly impressed by the Saigon regime's army



Novak and popular support. Surely, he reasoned,

anti-aid Congressmen would be similarly impressed by a firsthand view. Thus, he proposed a congressional visit to gain supporters in the forlorn fight for President Ford's \$300 million Vietnam aid emergency appropriation. The idea was approved by Mr. Ford a month ago, with Assistant Secretary of State Philip Habib assigned to enlist a delegation. He ran into trouble im-

mediately. Senior members of key committees generally refused to go. One exception was conscientious Sen. Clifford Case of New Jersey, senior Republican on the Foreign Relations Committee and long Vietnam dove. Leaving for the Lincoln Day recess, Case agreed to serve on the delegation. Returning a few days later, he changed his mind. While Case cited his busy schedule, the more likely reason is that he inspected the roster of others who had accepted and found them considerably junior to him.

Besides lacking seniority, that early roster was dominated by the minority of Congressmen who support Vietnam aid. The administration frantically sought

for doves. Habib, for instance, personally stature to effect anything in Washington. recruited Republican Rep. Pete McCloskey of California, who as a dove terrorized U.S. embassies on a 1971 Indochinese swing.

But other doves were volunteering without Habib's prodding to make sure the mission was not overly positive. One volunteer was Democratic Sen. Richard Clark of Iowa, who told us it is "very, very unlikely" anything he saw there could make him vote for aid. Vietnam, he added, "is not a military question to me."

A more ominous volunteer is the ineffable Rep. Bella Abzug of New York. 'Ridiculous!" stormed a top aide when he learned of her presence. Why does Mrs. Abzug, an unrelenting foe of the Thieu regime, want to go? "I'm interested in what's happening with the political prisoners," she told us.

The imbalance swinging from right to left gave some Congressmen the totally mistaken notion that Mr. Ford was stacking the delegation to dramatize for President Nguyen Van Thieu the mood in Congress. Several top officials (but not Habib) began souring on the project. "I'm afraid we're winding up with people who will go all over Vietnam

hunting for tiger cages," one told us. Cancellations began pouring in for-varied reasons besides the usual pleas of crowded schedules. Sen. Joseph Biden of Delaware, a liberal Democrat, got "the impression that it was going to be difficult to get a good look there." Sen. Paul Laxalt of Nevada, a conservative Republican, questioned whether delegation members had sufficient

Even if Biden and Laxalt had not cancelled, would it have mattered? Biden wants all aid ended and "can't imagine what could change my mind," unless it were proof of Communist reprisals against South Vietnamese after a military collpase. But Biden added quickly: "I question that I would even then." Laxalt opposes the \$300 million appropriation and "I don't think I'd ever see anything that would change me."

Nevertheless, hope persists at the State Department that, once on the scene in Vietnam, these closed minds and hearts would be opened by the facts. The hard-boiled appraisal at the White House seems more realistic: those few Congressmen willing to make the trip, and the motives for accepting by some of them, deepen the doubts that Congress will long fulfill the nation's remaining

U.S. Marriage Rate Drops For First Time In 12 Years; Divorces Increasing

in the U.S. fertility rate slowed and began leveling off last year, the national Center for Health Statistics said.

The center, an arm of the Department of Health, Education and Welfare, said provisional 1974 statistics show that both the total number of marriages and the marriage rate de-creased for the first time since

There were 2,223,000 marriages performed last year, 54,-000 or 2.4 per cent fewer than in 1973. The marriage rate decreased 3.7 per cent, to 10.5 per 1,000 population.

The report said the marriage decline occurred in every region of the country except the West South Central region encompassing Texas, which was one of 14 states with modest in-

The number of divorces totaled 970,000 last year, up 57,000 or 6.2 per cent over 1973 and 13.5 per cent higher than in 1962, which was the last year before the upward trend began.

The 1974 divorce rate of 4.6 per 1,000 population represented a record high 4.5 per cent increase over the previous year and a 109 per cent increase over 1962.
