Ford scheduled a 3 p.m. CDT announcement on his response to a Democratic proposal that he defer the higher tariffs while compromise talks are under way to shape an energy pro-

'Spirit Of Compromise' White House spokesmen insisted after the Republican leadership meeting that Ford had not reached a decision. But Senate GOP Leader Hugh Scott said concerning the tariff proposal: "It is certainly possible, given a spirit of compromise, that something may happen there."

Scott said that Ford didn't divulge any decision.

### Second \$1 Scheduled

The first \$1-a-barrel increase in Ford's plan to raise oil import tariffs has already gone into effect. The second \$1-a-barrel hike was scheduled to go into effect this month.

Republican congressmen he will veto the bill Tuesday morning. The President had promised the veto, and Tuesday midnight is the deadline.

Democrats are planning an attempt to override the veto, but Scott said he was confident the veto would be sustained.



JERUSALEM - Israel and the U.S. may be veering toward collision, a potenhal tragedy which would have dangerous repercussions on the Arab-Israeli struggle and might plunge this shining, emblematic nation into a crisis of politics nit self-doubt.

Storm Signals are flying, with Israell eliticians conceding deep uncertainty how to manage the policy divisions between Jerusalem and Washington over second-stage withdrawal from the Egyptian Sinai.

The widening gap between Israel's view of American obligations and a more skeptical view of Israeli policy by U.S. politicians was dramatized when Ambassador Kenneth Keating received a private briefing on the new Israeli budget. After explaining their request for \$2.590 billion in new U.S. aid, finance minister Yousha Rabinowitz was stunned that Keating, according to one official present, declined to give the request utematic approval.

Rabinowits, grappling with a grave economic crisis, could not believe what he heard. Twisting his tie in unfeigned anxiety, he pleaded with Keating to tell-Washington he fully supported the request. But Keating promised only that he would tell President Ford the request

# The Washington Merry-Go-Round

WASHINGTON - As the fighting over Cambodia approaches the showdown stage, according to classified cables from the U.S. embassy, Communist forces have turned upon the civilian population with a sudden savagery.

The cables describe a bloodbath in the countryside. Villages have been destroyed, and the inhabitants "have been ruthlessly executed by knifing or burning." Even small children have been

"The enemy appears to have shifted some of the focus of his attacks from the battlefield to the village," ambassador John Gunther Dean has reported in a grim message to the State Department. ". . Ignoring static (government) defensive military positions, the enemy has concentrated their attacks on villages directing their fire at villagers."

Villagers who resist Communist overtures, says Dean, are declared the 'main enemy," with Buddhist monks next and government troops third.

'This is not an isolated phenomena,' (sic) claims Dean, "but rather seems to be indicative of a new enemy strategy to inflict even more suffering on the civilian population of Cambodia.

The classified cables refer to the opposing forces by their French initials. Government troops are called FANK and Communist guerrillas are identified

"FANK has not shown the ability to protect villages from Communist attack," Dean reports tersely. ". . . KC, by keeping refugees off farmland and nonproductive, continues to demoralize their spirit."

Our intelligence sources point out that terror has been used by both sides in Cambodia. Government troops have been accused in the past of ugly atrocities. But the reports from the Cambodian hinterland have seldom been more

# Information Freedom **Except For Congress**

WASHINGTON - "Freedom of information" has such a nice democratic ring to it that President Johnson signed the first such law on the Fourth of July in 1966.

A decade in the making, the Freedom of Information Act was intended to force the people's government to open up its files to the people, unless. .

Of course, it was all the "unlesses" that made the law far less effective than the Congress had hoped. The weakness was caused primarily by nine categories of exemptions, such as national security or trade secrets.

These exemptions were broad enough to permit clever bureaucrats to circumvent the intent of the law in most

So for the next eight years, Congress and citizens gathered evidence of the law's ineffectiveness. It was amended late last year to close loopholes, and the refurbished law went into effect

But while Congress has acted to give the people access to more of the executive branch's modus operandi. Congress also has unintentionally revealed a large vein of hypocrisy that runs through that body politic. You see, there is no Freedom of

Information Act that applies to Congress. One of Ralph Nader's investigators plans to use the new law to get copies of letters between the Department of Transportation and Detroit concerning auto safety standards.

But should that same investigator claim a citizen's right to see auto safety legislation files in the House and Senate committees that draft such bills, he would laughed off Capitol Hill.


WASHINGTON - First it was said in guarded, hushed tones. Now some are brave enough to declare it outright. There is something missing in this town, a sense of leadership. Moreover, there is the eerie realization that the pre-Watergate President Nixon provided what is so sorely lacking now.

Whatever one concludes about Nixon as President, he imparted a sense of command and sparked an adversary relationship with his political foes which was creative and also kept them alert.

There is no such alertness now. These days, this town is more stupefied than activist. The pre-Watergate Nixon and his opponents played hard ball, but it was big league. What we have now dreary, almost pointless, sandlot-boring and meandering.

In the years before the Nixon Presidency crumbled, there was lively disputation over Vietnam, the defense budget, revenue sharing, school busing and school integration. There were fights over the establishment of the Domestic Affairs Coucil, the Office of Management and Budget, the Council on Environmental Quality, indeed, the Environmental Protection Agency itself.

They came to fight, the Nixon people and the adversaries, and somehow Vietnam ended; revenue sharing and all the rest became productive realities. Something happened, maybe not enough,



spiced occasionally with gossip about how Mr. Ford's Grand Rapids corps resents the possible reaches for power from Vice President Nelson A. Rockefeller's office. These are not commanding waves, but only silly ripples.


### WAIT! Laredo Receives Plague For Work Earl Scheib On Old Air Base

LAREDO, Tex. (AP) - The City of Laredo has received the nation's first recognition plaque from the Defense Department for its efforts in converting a closed Air Force base to civil-

Bill Sheehan, chairman of the Federal Office of Economic Adjustments told city officials, as he turned over the base's deed to them, "The Laredo base has shown the greatest progress in economic adjustment from over 270 base closures across the nation since April 1, 1973."

Laredo officials have leased base property and buildings to 39 industries and restored civilian employment to 500. The base, at one time, employed 2,000 civilian workers and 4,000 military personnel.
