ALGIERS (AP)-Kuwait has decided to take over 100 per cent of all the foreign oil companies operating its huge oilfields, the official Algerian news agency said today, quoting Kuwait's oll min-ister, Abdelmoutaleb Kazimi.

Kazimi told the agency the companies have been summoned * to open, negotiations next week "on the details of the transfer of ownership of the petroleum and gas to the Kuwaiti state and people."

Kazimi is attending the current summit conference of the 13-nation Organization of Petroleum Exporting Countries and could not be immediately reached to confirm the report. Kuwait is the world's fourth largest petroleum exporter and a founding member of OPEC. It previously took over 60 per cent of the holding of British Petroleum and the Gulf Oil Co., whose Kuwait production peaked at 2,925,000 barrels a day in 1972.

"From this moment on," Kazimi said, "the Kuwaiti state has become owner of the totality of the shares held up to now by the two companies, namely 40 per cent. Consequently, Kuwait's petroleum has returned to its rightful owners, which will permit us to elaborate a

National leaders of most of the OPEC states were meeting today to complete a "solemn declaration of principles" they think should govern long-term relations with their customers. They may include in the declaration some of the points made by Algeria's President Houari Boumedienne in a speech opening the conference on Tuesday.

Freeze Proposed

The Algerian leader proposed a freeze in the "real" price of dustrialized countries take part in a massive program of aid for the developing nations. He also proposed a special OPEC fund of \$10 billion-\$15 billion to help countries in economic difficulties pay their sharply increased bills.

The declaration, drafted by a preparatory meeting of oil, finance and foreign ministers last weekend, is to be published at the end of the three-day summit conference, probably on Thursday.

Left Out At Night

While several thousand federal prisoners across the country are attending colleges, Karl Borgstrom, an assistant UCSB dean, said the program here is the only one in which the prisoners don't return to their cells

The university is carrying out the pilot project on contract for the Bureau of Prisons.

Since the program began last March, 15 "residents," as they are called, have gone through it and continued their education

One is working in marine biology in Hawaii, two others are working elsewhere, one is attending the University of California at Los Angeles and the others are continuing studies at UCSB.

Mrs. Frantz said it has helped ease the pains of adjustment and transition from incarceration to civilian life through a community-based program.

The convict-students have to meet the same academic admission standards as all regular applicants.

"But many of them are older than normal university students with their ages ranging from 23 to 40," said Borgstrom, "Also they must be juniors or seniors and they must have a specific education goal in mind before

Biggest Givers (?)

Take a guess, please . . . where do most of the donations come from-large foundations or individual American citizens?

You're right, far more donations come from individual American citizens, according to Dr. Robert Sutherland, professor emeritus of sociology and president emeritus of the Hogg Foundation for Mental Health at The University of Texas-Austin.

But the percentage difference may surprise you. Dr. Sutherland points out that individuals and families account for 75 to 80 per cent of all giving in the United States, while foundations contribute only 10 per cent of the total. Bequests and corporations account for the remaining gifts.

The educator says, however, that the large foundations get most of the publicity, which certainly is understandable, due to the usual size of the gifts.

The Washington Merry-Go-Round

WASHINGTON — Every three weeks, 19 anonymous men meet behind closed doors at the Federal Reserve Board. The full transcripts of their hearings are not made public for six years. Yet their secret decisions vitally affect the economic welfare of all Americans.

These faceless men form the Fed's powerful, policymaking Open Market Committee, which manipulates the money supply. For a year and a half they held back money and forced up interest rates. This caused a credit crisis, which compelled private industry to cut back production, curb expansion and lay off workers

Result: The worst recession since the great crash of 1929.

In human terms, businessmen have gone bankrupt, workers have been turned into the streets and pensioners can no longer make ends meet. Each mail brings us the poignant stories of people

But the Anonymous Nineteen, who largely are responsible for these economic hardships, are insulated from the misery they have caused. They belong to the narrow world of bonds, banks and boardrooms. They make their economic decisions in a glass bubble, sealed off from the human consequences.

Even their employes are sheltered. People who work at the Fed receive special benefits that other federal employes only dream about.

Among those recreational blessings are free theater tickets, baseball tickets, bowling shirts, softball equipment, dance parties, beach cabin rentals; bingo parties, ping pong balls, art shows, music recitals, camera supplies and flowers.

The Fed also operates a thrift plan, which requires the taxpayers to put up 25 cents for every dollar the employe saves, up to \$750. The surroundings in many Fed offices also are extravagant. The New York Federal Reserve, for instance, paid an artist \$7,236 for painting a portrait of its chairman.

The Anonymous Nineteen, with few exceptions, have banking backgounds. They are closer to the banks than dimes in a five-dollar roll. Yet they are supposed to regulate the banks and influence interest rate changes. This is like



authorizing a committee of railroad presidents to set freight rates.

Like the recession, the rate of recovery will depend largely upon the Anonymous Nineteen. What goes on behind the Fed's closed doors, therefore, will have enormous consequences. Yet neither the White House nor the Congress has much control over the Fed.

Watching the Fed is about as scintillating as watching a sliced apple turn brown. Few besides bankers and economists bother to plow through the technical jargon and numbing graphs. The myth is that such high finance is too complex for the citizenry. It may be closer to the truth that the myth was created to discourage close examination of the Fed's operations.

But here, essentially, is how it Bible Verse works: The Fed controls the money supply by (1) setting reserve requirements for banks and (2) by buying and selling Treasury bonds on the open market.

Because of the banking bias of the Anonymous Nineteen, they have been most concerned about controlling shortterm interest rates, which are the most troublesome for bankers. This shortterm, shortsighted policy has helped produce the boom-and-bust roller coaster economy which gives the American people such a rough ride.

The Fed also has a tendency to do too much, too late. It is just beginning to increase the money supply, for example, even though the nation has been in a recession for more than six months. Not only is this action too late, but some experts fear the Fed again will overreact and spark another inflationary spiral by creating new money too fast and for too long.

Seven of the Anonymous Nineteen are appointed for 14-year terms, and they can't be fired. The other 12 serve

The U.S. Navy, about to celebrate 60 years of naval aviation with the dedication of a new Naval Air Museum at Pensacola, Fla., in April, suddenly finds itself under the twin guns of the Pentagon and Congress.

The aim of both the new 94th Congress and the Defense Department is to get the Navy off dead center in its consideration of a relatively cheap, lightweight carrier fighter plane.

The Navy's position and growing pressure from the Pentagon and Congress are dramatized by the U.S. Air Force's selection of the General Dynamics Corp. to build its version of a new lightweight fighter - the YF-16. It's a single jet engine, single-seat interceptor which flies at supersonic speeds and costs \$4.6 million each - about a third the cost of the Air Force's heavier \$14.5 million fighter, the F-15 House pressure.

could be an even better deal for the Pentagon and the American taxpayer. Its cost would be about \$5.5 million each compared to the \$18.2 million per copy the Navy is paying for its new, heavier F-14 Tomcat carrier fighter.

THE CONSUMER ALERT-Consider Cost Of Repair Bills

AUSTIN - Some consumers are economizing by deciding to have older major appliances repaired, rather than replacing them with new models when trouble develops. But, having made a decision to save

the cost of a new appliance such as a television, a number of persons have been dismayed to learn that their repair bill was far higher than they expected. It's not only the repair bill that

consumers complain about, however. Frequent sources of customer each city studied. dissatisfaction are lengthy waiting periods for repair service, unauthorized repairs, unnecessary replacement of parts and subsequent charges, and unsatisfactory work.

The Attorney General's Consumer Protection Division receives numerous that he would be reimbursed for replaccomplaints about television repair service from unhappy consumers. Our records show, though, that some complaints are

valid and others are not.

Still, some complaints about television repair service are justified. In a recent study conducted by the Federal Trade Commission, new television sets with no problems other than one burned-out tube were sent for repairs in several cities.

Cost for repairs on the sets varied by as much as 400 per cent between the lowest and highest charges in one city. And "parts fraud," the unnecessary replacing of parts or charging for parts not actually replaced, was reported in

But the study also indicated that one especially alert repairman charged nothing for replacing the faulty tube. He had noted a date code on the tube indicating that it was still under manufacturer's warranty and realized

No doubt there are many such scrupulously honest and observant television repairmen. And it's doubly frustrating for a person who is trying to economize to feel that perhaps he or she has been 'taken" by such a repairman. In order to avoid possible problems with television repairs or repair charges, our Consumer Protection Division recommends following these guidelines:

1. When you purchase a television set, always read the owner's manual to learn how to make simple adjustments yourself. This is especially important with color television sets. This simple step could save you a service call later.

2. If a repair seems needed, first check to see if your tv is covered by warranty. If so, perhaps the repairs will be paid by the manufacturer.

3. If your warranty already has expired, always get three estimates from reliable, established local repairmen. Try to get recommendations from friends or relatives who have had good service. And always check in advance to determine if there is a charge for a serv-

4. Always get estimates in writing the best picture. Other problems are consumer's lack of knowledge about of the work that's needed, completion

5. When the repair work is done, ask for an itemized list of all replaced parts and all repairs. And have all old, replaced parts returned to you so you can be sure they really were defective.

Orchids and Onions

The recent series of energy messages Mobil ran in this newspaper under the title, "Toward a National Energy Policy," included an offer for reprints of the entire series and invited comment. We expected about 1,000 requests. Our cup runneth over.

Our first printing may soon runneth out. We've already received more than 10,000 requests for over 20,000 reprints.

Most writers simply asked for the reprints. but many also shared their views with us.

We were heartened by the number of "orchids" we received. Nearly 90 percent of the mail generally agreed with the thrust of the series—the need for Washington to get moving on an effective national energy policy. A science teacher requested copies for his ecology students and said he couldn't recall seeing "a more up-to-date, dynamic exposition toward energy." Many writers asked for copies to send to their Congressmen. (We've already done that.)

We didn't send any to the "onion" writer who rubber-stamped an unpublishable comment across an ad he obviously disagreed with. Clever, but not constructive.

Among the constructive comments were calls for balance between conservation efforts and increased energy supplies. Said a Ph.D. candidate in political science: "A/failure to undertake necessary development and conservation efforts could result in social, political, and economic chaos in whose aftermath the principles of democratic government could wither and die." And a Bronxite, who hates, "you oily, greasy robber barons," nevertheless made the point that "I don't want clean Cadillacs. I want people riding at 30 MPG."

Cooperation between industry and government was another theme. Take, for example, the Florida man who felt "we're in as severe a national crisis with energy as we've ever been with world wars...but we're not going to get anywhere fighting between ourselves about it." A businessman called for "a Manhattan-type project...to make the United States self sufficient, if need be, at the earliest possible moment."

At the earliest possible moment...

That thought was perhaps the one most frequently expressed.

Such comments as "now," and "desperately needed," mingled with requests to continue our efforts "...until a comprehensive national energy policy, both short-term and long-term, will become an actuality." Obviously, many Americans agree 1975 should be the year of energy action.

One of the most articulate calls for action came from a high school honor student, who sent us a copy of a letter she wrote a U.S. Senator.

Reference is made," she said to the Senator, "to the numerous statements that you and some of your colleagues have made relative to the 'obscene' excessive profits obtained from oil and gas production in this country. If indeed there are excessive profits in the oil and gas industry. I believe that instead of channeling these profits into the Federal treasury for eventual use in 'pork barrel' projects, they should be used for additional exploration and drilling, particularly in the Atlantic outer continental shelf area. This is necessary because the Canadian government has already indicated that it intends eventually to stop exporting crude oil to the United States. Congress must therefore take the necessary steps to encourage the oil and gas industry to explore for additional oil reserves so that the East Coast refineries will have adequate domestic crude oil for the future. Furthermore, the development of additional reserves in this country should create new jobs and provide raw materials for industries located in economically depressed areas of the United States.

"As an eleventh-grade high school student, am very concerned about the energy shortage and the economic stability of our country; therefore, I hope you and your colleagues will make an effort to find solutions for the problems. which require action now and which will confront my generation and future generations."
