



You may be using more than a ton of coal a year without even knowing it.

The reason you don't know you're using this coal is because it comes to you in the form of electricity.

We now have two power plants that use Texas lignite coal. They account for about 20% of our total generation. We figure they use an average of more than one ton of coal annually for each residential customer.

One other lignite plant is under construction. By 1980, when almost half of the electricity we generate will be with lignite, you may be using three to four tons of coal a year.

We're using lignite because new supplies of natural gas and oil — our traditional fuels — are hard to get and increasingly expensive.

This, plus the higher costs of building power plants that use lignite, together with inflation means that electricity is going to have to cost

But because lignite fuel itself is more economical, it will help us keep the price of electricity from increasing as much as it would if we tried to depend on new, more costly supplies

of natural gas and oil.

One other big advantage of lignite is that it isn't being used extensively for anything other than the generation of electricity.

We're continuing the orderly development

of our power system so that you'll continue having the electricity you need.

One of the ways we're doing it is by using a fuel that you can't use yourself.

Britain's Kim Philby and Sweden's Stig Eric Wennerstrom, two of the most celebrated Soviet international agents, were exposed with the help of Golytsyn, as well as lesser spies in Germany, France and NATO.

In time, the strong-willed Golytsyn tired of CIA surveillance and decided to take his complaints to the late Robert Kennedy, then the attorney general. The defector was housed within walking the highest ranking Soviet defectors distance of Kennedy's home in northern Virginia and visited with him either at his home or in another private place, our sources recall.

Gotytsyn alno drafted a long letter laying out his problems to Kennedy and expressed his pique to John McCone, then the CIA head. This upset the CIA agents who had gone to such lengths to protect him as hiring rent-a-cars to visit him so the tag numbers couldn't be traced back to "security" cars.

They agreed to let him go to Britain, however, for further debriefing by the British. Our sources say he was last reported living in the United States under superbly contrived false identity.

SHAN CONNECTION: The colorful Shan guerrillas have made another signed, secret offer to sell most of the Southeast Asian opium crop to the U.S. government at the prevailing black market price. This would dry up 20per cent of the heroin supply now reaching the United States.

The Shan hillmen are willing to back up their offer, moreover, by attacking any other convoys that try to bring pium out of the back country.

The offer has been relayed to Washington through Rep. Lester Wolff, D.-N.Y., chairman of a House narcotics subcommittee and the House's leading expert on Burma-Thai-Laos opium production.

It has been submitted to the House Foreign Affairs Committee in a secret subcommittee report, signed by Chairman Wolff, Rep. Morgan Murphy, D.-Ill., and Rep. J. Herbert Burke, R.,-

A similar offer was rejected by the U.S. government in August, 1973. With the lifting of the ban on opium growing in Turkey, however, the United States can expect a flood of illegal heroin, which is refined from opium.

To buy the Shan's opium crop would cost \$24 million, double the 1973 price. "It is important to note," explains the secret report, "that . . . the Shans will be receiving the market price for opium that they would have otherwise sold on the black market. The effect will be to divert narcotics from an illicit to a licit purchaser."

Returning from a visit to Hanoi in January, Sihanouk seemed even more resigned to Hanoi's hegemony over all Indochina, including Cambodia. To a Western visitor in mid-February, the Prince seemed morose, expressing doubt he could serve any useful purpose in Cambodia and again yearning for the Riviera.

Nor is Peking calling the Cambodian tune. Although military supplies for the insurgents come from China, 2,000 military advisers in the field are North Vietnamese (as are some 8,000 logistical troops). Having trained Cambodian insurgents while North Vietnamese divisions held the field for three years, Hanoi remains the dominant political

And Hanoi is notoriously allergic to negotiating when its troops are on top. The clandestine radio of Cambodia's insurgents, located near Hanoi and run by Vietnamese, on March 3 indicted President Lon Nol and six other Cambodian leaders: "Our Cambodian people.

. cannot forgive these traitors. We must eliminate them." Any doubt about what "eliminate" meant was ended March 6 when Sihanouk told Reuters that six of the seven (excluding former Premier Son Ngoc Thanh, now in Saigon) would "probably be executed."

Nobody who has studied Communist control over nearly all of Cambodia's countryside and one-third of its population believes the list would end at six or seven notables. There is abundant evidence of drumhead justice in the provinces, with officials secretly executed by stabbing.

Ordinary villagers are scarcely immune. Refugees and defecting Communist soldiers agree that in July 1974, after capturing Ta Hen outpost of Battambang province, insurgents executed 900 men, women and children. Besides other well documented massacres, insurgents have been burning villages, collectivizing farmers, and repressing Buddhist observances.

In short, when anti-aid congressmen argue to end aid rather than "prolong Cambodia's agony," they are urging the United States to hasten a brutal campaign against one of the world's oldest. most sophisticated cultures.

enezuela Offers Half Billion By WILLIAM GIANDONI

Copley News Service Oil-rich Venezuela is arranging to put some of its petro-dollars to work

in Latin America. Eventually, the South American country plans to make \$500 million available to finance projects and programs that contribute to development

of less-favored hemisphere republics. The funds will be administered by the Inter-American Development Bank, Washington, D.C., under terms of a contract signed in the U.S. capital Feb.

The idea originated with Venezuelan President Carlos Andres Perez, who broached it a year ago in his inaugural address, March 12, 1974.

At that time, some Latin countries were making no secret of their displeasure at Venezuela's reluctance to share the windfall profits of the oil

The arrangement with the Inter

American bank provides that Venezuela will put up the money in 10 equal, consecutive installments over a five-year period. The fund will remain in effect for a quarter of a century, and may be extended.

The Venezuelan gesture is to be no give-away program.

Resources of the Trust Fund will be administered within criteria of security and profitability," is the way the Inter American Development Bank put

Use Notrump Play At Trump Contracts

If you open up a bridge spade, and West takes two spade player's head (which may be a good idea, at that), you will find all sorts of plays filed away in separate compartments. One compartment may be labeled "For Notrump Only," and that should tell you that you've opened the wrong head. Don't use such labels in your own head.
