B. C. McMinn, executive vice president of Furr's at Lubbock, said today in a telephone in-terview that a purchase option on property owned by his company at the southeast corner of Scharbauer Drive and Big Spring Street here had not been picked up by the Allem Corp. of El Paso.

McMinn said Furr's will "not extend the option" to the El Paso contractor beyond today. -He said, "At this time it is our plan to build a retail food store on the property.'

The site has been backed by the Midland Housing Authority and the city council for the past several months as Midland's choice for the federal housing project. The Department of Housing and Urban Development at. Dallas has repeatedly told the local officials that the site is not acceptable.





In its 12th weekly session, the commission took testimony Monday from a panel of aca demic experts in the field of individual privacy, apparently in an effort to draft recommendations to prevent future domestic wrongdoings by the CIA.

The scholars were unanimous in favoring creation of a public code of ethics governing intelligence gathering, said Prof. Edward J. Bloustein, president of Rutgers University.

Sports In Spurts . . . Controversy In Arizona

Sports in spurts and, quick now, what collgiate coach in Los Angeles has won the most NCAA titles? . . . Midland Cub Manager

Howard "Doc" Edwards, back in his early 1960 days with the Cleveland Indians spent several springs in Arizona. Since then and until this year, Doc has been taking his spring training in Florida.

Which does he prefer?

"Florida for the first two weeks when you are trying to lose some weight and get in shape. The humidity makes Florida ideal," says Doc. "However, once you are in shape, I think Arizona is better."...





As the plight of the U.S. economy becomes obvious, experts finally are beginning to query whether the United States can afford the massive - and highly inflationary - expenditure required to satisfy water quality, air pollution, waste treatment and noise control legislation enacted between 1970 and 1972. The emerging conclusion: We can't.

Washington University (St. Louis) Prof. Murray Weidenbaum has made a major contribution by analyzing the inflationary impact of federal regulation. In his study, "Government-Mandated Price Increases," published by the American Enterprise Institute, Weidenbaum showed, among other things, how the price of a new 1974 passenger automobile was about \$320 higher than it would have been without federallymandated safety and environmental re-

Then there is noise control. Weidenbaum notes that standards limiting workers' daily noise exposure (scheduled to become effective Jan. 1, 1978) will saddle U.S. industry with a compliance cost of \$31.6 billion. In many metal industries, product prices will be forced up considerably to pay for noise reduc-

WASHINGTON (KFS) - There are and Public Policy." Here is their summation of the horrible costs involved:

> "In the case of water pollution control not all of the standards set in the 1972 act have yet been translated into specific requirements for industry. But the costs will be very large. The National Water Council (NWC) roughly estimated that between 1972 and 1983 the cumulative costs of meeting the requirement to use the best known technology (not for zero discharge), set out in the 1972 water pollution amendments, will be \$220 billion. . . On the basis of data in the 1973 Report of the Council on Environmental Quality, the costs of reaching the air quality standards of the 1970 amendments may approach \$135 billion to \$140 billion over the same period. Together the two programs may cost some \$375 billion in the 1972-85 period."

> Since these estimates were made, the authors note, some of the standards have been relaxed or postponed. But other new costs and problems have been discovered. "Taking all of these factors into account," say Kneese and Schultze, "It is not unreasonable to set a conservative estimate of \$500 billion as the overall national cost of meeting, by the early 1980s, the goals set forth in the 1970 and 1972 legislation. . ." After 1980, the annual cost would be \$50-60 billion.

Criticizing the legislative process through which these requirements originated, the Brookings scholars lament that environment program costs do not receive the scrutiny that costs receive in military or federal highway programs:

"Environmental control programs are different. A large fraction of their costs will be borne not by the federal government but by individuals in the form of more expensive electricity, fuel, paper, automobiles and other goods and services, and by state and local taxpayers. . . Because their costs do not draw the attention that the budget can focus on the usual federal program, efficiency. . . is not a central concern in designing environmental strategies."

Their point is all too true. Excessive environmental standards may be as inflationary as Middle Eastern oil price hikes; they are already forcing up taxes, and they threaten to divert capital that U.S. industry badly needs for retooling in order to remain competitive in world markets. Yet Congress barely has begun

It is time to face economic reality. Further extension of 1970 and 1972 environmental regulation should suspended pending detailed cost-benefit studies and evaluation of the sensible alternative anti-pollution strategy (stiff taxes on actual pollution discharge) proposed by Messrs. Kneese and Schultze. -

with Les Whitten WASHINGTON -- A few days ago, we nominated Turner B. Shelton, the American ambassador to Nicaragua, as the worst in the U.S. diplomatic service.

We described him as one of the last survivors of the Ugly American era, living in splendor in an enormous hilltop mansion with 20 sunrooms and huge verandas. He had refused to move in, we wrote; until the verandas were the state growth, development and glassed in the windows sealed and the

When an earthquake later leveled the capital city of Managua, we reported the great mansion was one of the few buildings left intact. It was desperately needed for a casualty hospital. Yet the offer was never made

For such actions, we wrote, Shelton was rebuked by the State Department. Our associate. Joe Spear, telephoned him in Managua to seek his comments. The ambassador cordially denied everything. Then his wife grabbed the telephone and told us off in less cordial language.

Since we carefully had pinned down the facts, however, we stuck to our story. Now congressmen and diplomats are calling us to defend Shelton. We are obliged, therefore, to publish some of our evidence

Shelton insisted he had not been reprimanded by the State Department. In fact, he invited his own reprimand. On Jan. 18, 1973, he fired off an incredible cable to the home office, intended for official eyes only.

'The Department," he fumed, "is



fully aware the earthquake which struck Managua in the early morning of Dec. 23. 1972, destroyed almost all of the office space in the city, including the American embassy, chancery and more than 50,000 residences.

"As a consequence, the continued operation of the embassy along with its component elements is extremely dubious and in many cases almost impossible. It has exposed U.S. embassy personnel to sun, heat, dust and high winds and obviously this situation cannot be allowed to continue

His own spacious, air-conditioned residence, of course, stood-virtually empty. Yet Shelton declared he was going to lease the La Cuesta country club as a temporary office building.

"In this way," he cabled, "we can some degree alleviate the strain presently existing on embassy person-He also demanded more help be sent down, including secretaries and a "bilingual assistant." This request presumably stemmed from his own lack of fluency in Spanish.

He wanted "prefabricated housing" and seven "air-conditioned carryalls" to replace the embassy's damaged vehicles, he added.

"I wish to emphasize in the strongest possible terms," declared Shelton, "that three weeks after the earthquake, which almost destroyed Managua, the embassy and all its elements still finds itself in much the same condition as the day after the earthquake."

Ambassador Shelton, who bragged his close relationship with Richard Nixon, perhaps was stung hardest when embassy employes received personal letters of appreciation from the former President. Shelton waited in vain for

The CIA's Sen. Howard Baker Problem

WASHINGTON - The reason why the Central Intelligence Agency (CIA) fears a conservative Republican. Sen. Howard Baker of Tennessee, more than all its liberal critics in the Senate was revealed during a recent political trip by Baker to nurture his presidential ambitions One prominent Republican

businessman, in private conversation with the senator, was given the distinct impression that Baker had information which when released would put the CIA in a very bad light and possibly link it to the Watergate scandal. businessman, an unreconstructed Nixonite, took heart from the chat that perhaps Richard M. Nixon was the victim, not the corrupter, of the CIA, despite proof to the contrary provided by the White House tapes. "I am carrying on no vendetta

against the CIA," Baker told us. Nevertheless, as a member of the Senate committee investigating the CIA, he is following the same leads he pursued Watergate committee. Unable then to implicate the CIA in the Watergate scandal, Baker is trying again now with virtually unlimited access to the agency's documents.

Thus. Baker seems intent on using the current investigation for the self-vindication he apparently considers essential his presidential ambitions. That is why the CIA's defenders in both the administration- and the Senate regard



him as far less judicious and far more ominous than chairman Frank Church of Idaho and the other liberal Democrats on the committee.

This is steeped in irony, considering Baker's consistent hard line on foreign policy (including his present courageous support of aid to Vietnam). On the record, he supports the essentiality of the CIA, including its covert activities sting of which the senator felt severely. now under attack. In fact, he says he would have preferred a more discreet congressional watchdog committee to the

present investigation. Moreover, Howard Baker has been with conspicuous failure on the Senate regarded as a figure of great ability and greater promise ever since he entered, the Senate in 1967 - up to a point. That point is raised by his fierce ambition and tendency toward

overcleverness in dealing with sensitive political situations. For example, while getting national exposure in the televised Watergate hearings as an even-handed investigator. Baker behind the scenes was President

tioned CIA officials. By tying CIA to Watergate, he could simultaneously be the fearless investigator and loyal Nixon

Baker demanded - and was refused - all manner of CIA documents, chilling his relationship with CIA director William Colby. The end product: a report, bitterly resented as unfair by the CIA, which insinuated much and proved nothing.

What's more, he still contends he is on no fishing expedition but has good reason - which he cannot divulge to believe there is something unrevealed regarding CIA connections with Watergate. That line is so reminiscent of his I've-got-a-secret assertions of Watergate days that CIA defenders are naturally alarmed.
