

# Ford, Solons Meet

WASHINGTON (AP) -President Ford told Republican congressional leaders today the evacuation of Americans from Saigon is being speeded and the number remaining in the South Vietnamese capital will be down to 1,500 by nightfall.

As recently as a week ago, some 5,000 Americans were re-ported in the Saigon area.

Sen. Clifford Case, R-N.J. one of the GOP leaders who spent nearly two hours conferring with Ford and Secretary of State Henry A. Kissinger, told reporters: "We have succeeded in stimulating the evacuation





### **Consumers Buying More Options For** Their Small Cars

sumers are buying fewer and smaller cars, but they're ordering more optional equipment than ever before.

Installation of extra-cost items such as air conditioning, power brakes, vinyl tops, bigger engines and power windows is setting records despite the over-all sales slump, the auto companies report.

More Stuff Ordered

"People are buying smaller cars but they're putting more stuff on them." says an analyst at Ford Motor Co. "The upward trend in options has been going on for 20 years, and 1975 is no exception."

Adding more options may partially defeat the fuel-saving objectives of some small car buyers. Air conditioning, for example, uses up about one-half mile per gallon. And any option adds weight to the car, with a corresponding increase in fuel consumption.

The companies say they are selling more options partly because more are being offered - on small cars as well as larger models.

Profits Boosted

They say they make the options available because the consumer wants them. But the heavily promoted items also boost the auto makers' profit margins, traditionally lower on smaller, stripped-down models.

"Many buyers now want more luxurious trim levels and options than on their earlier cars," said Ford Vice President John B. Naugeton. "They are interested in comfort and convenience, and they are willing to pay for it."

For example, 94 per cent of all Chevrolet Novas sold so far this model year were ordered with an optional automatic transmission. Last year, only 92 per cent had the option.

Increase Cited Similarly, power steering was ordered on 95 per cent of this year's Dodge Darts, compared with 93 per cent last year. Air conditioning in the Ford Torino is up from 84 per cent last year to 88 per cent.

The installation rates of other options such as power door locks, AM-FM stereo radios and deluxe wheel covers also are up from a year ago.

These options, sometimes marketed in discount packages by the companies, cost hundreds of dollars - air conditioning alone costs around \$400.



He said the city's population is now about 900,000, including 500,000 refugees, and that 200,-000 are being moved back to the rural areas from which they came. Films taken by Gaignaire showed Viet Cong soldiers in crisp green uniforms directing traffic, schools open and several people criticizing the Saigon government.

He said the first thing that struck one was the absence of street peddlers and beggars thrived under Saigon's

A Viet Cong member of the new military government said its first problem had been "the unemployed, the prostitutes and all those without means of support. We have changed this city of debauchery.'

Officials of the Saigon regime "who have realized their mistakes" had been put to work in productive jobs, the Viet Cong man said

To Sue New Mexico **Over Water Rights** WASHINGTON (AP) - The

U.S. Supreme Court has given Texas permission to sue New Mexico in a dispute over water rights in the Pecos River, which runs through New Mexico and Texas and is one of the principal tributaries of the lower Rio Grande.

Texas claims that New Mexi-co has violated the Pecos River Compect of 1948, which both legislatures of both states ratified and Congress approved, by depriving it of water from 1950 to 1972.

The motion says Texas will continue to suffer "grave and irreparable injury" unless the court forces New Mexico to

honor the compact.

The court, which has original jurisdiction in disputes between states, gave New Mexico 60 days to answer Texas' allega-tions. Then the court will decide whether to hear oral arguments, appoint a special mas-ter to hear the case or simply

hand down a ruling.

In a brief opposing the Texas motion for permission to file the suit, New Mexico claimed the matter could not be decided in a court of law because it was presently under review by two-member Pecos River Cor mission. Each state is repr



# Peace Moves Stuck On 'Dead Center'

WASHINGTON - After the carefully crafted U.S. strategy for the Middl East collapsed on March 22, Egypt and Israel both indicated the next move would be a reconvening of the Geneva conference, probably in June.

That still remains the most likely possibility for a new forum where the major affected powers can make a new effort to find a basis for peace between Israel and its Arab neighbors.

But the lack of movement toward fixing a date, toward a decision on how the Palestinian Liberation Organization will be represented, toward drawing up an agenda or pinning down other details, raises doubts whether a new conference can be held that soon, if

For the moment there is little chance of a new Kissinger initiative, unless Egypt and Israel can suddenly find a way to narrow their differences-a most unlikely possibility.

To fill the present void, President Ford has ordered a complete review of U.S. Middle Eastern policy, an attempt to reassess basic U.S. interests and goals there, and how to go about achieving

That study, although ordered late in March, is just now getting seriously under way in the National Security Council under the guidance of Joseph Sisco, undersecretary of state for political af-

It may possibly be completed by the end of April.

When it is, neither the White House nor State Department has disclosed whether the main conclusions will be publicly annnounced at that time, or whether they will just quietly be put into effect as new U.S. policy lines

In any event, a new U.S. move in the Middle East is not expectable until the new policy is ready to be put in

In the meantime a request by Israel for \$2.6 billion in new aid-\$1.8 billion military and \$800 million economic -is being held in abeyance. The implication is that U.S. pressure is being exerted on Israel to conform more closely to U.S. desires or face the possibility that future aid may be curtailed.

Egyptian Foreign Minister Ismail Fahmi is planning to visit Moscow soon to thrash out a mutual Egyptian-Soviet approach to Geneva.

It's always possible, too, those talks could revive plans for Soviet Gene Secretary Leonid Brezhnev to visit Cairo, a trip that was canceled early this year when Egypt decided to stay with the now-collapsed K i s s i n g e r step-by-step

The Soviets have vocally supported a return to Geneva for some time, while objecting to the Kissinger efforts, partly because those efforts left Moscow, out of the settlement process.

Now that the Soviets may be about to resume a leading role in that process at Geneva, they have adopted a much more cautious line

Included is a recent approach to Israel to sound out what it would and would

not accept in swapping territory for Moscow obviously does not want to

go to Geneva if all preliminary signs indicate it could expect only a debacle there-a totally intransigent Israel faced off against its Arab enemies.

# The Washington Merry-Go-Round

WASHINGTON - It isn't easy to damage the economy, ecology and energy programs all at the same time, but the Navy has managed to do it.

As a dramatic example, the aircraft carrier Independence dumped 7.500 gallons of aviation fuel, worth about \$4,000, into the sea a few weeks ago.

Caught in the act, the Navy explained was cheaper to pump the gas over the side than to unload it on shore. Such dumping incidents occur, said a spokesman, "very infrequently.

The Navy's own classified documents, however, tell a different story. In reports never intended to be read outside the Pentagon, Navy auditors have divulged that millions of gallons of fuel are routinely discharged into the oceans every year

This is fuel that allegedly is "contaminated." Yet it would be cheaper, according to the auditors, to being the fuel ashore and "reclaim" it.

In other words, the Navy would save money, conserve fuel and keep the oceans cleaner by stopping the dumping operations. The admirals were told this almost five years ago by their auditors. Yet Navy ships have continued to discharge fuel at sea.

The latest classified audits, dated Feb. 7, 1975; contain these findings:

- During the 1974 fiscal year, "Navy oilers disposed of approximately 6.2 million gallons of contaminated fuel at sea." As a result, the Navy not only lost the use of the energy" but also was required to replace the fuel at a cost of approximately \$2.3 million."

- The fuel discharges and inventory

million gallons of bulk petroleum worth about \$4.2 million" from oil tankers alone during fiscal 1974. This doesn't count the oil spills from the hundreds of other

The amount of fuel pumped overboard, the auditors found, "declined with the advent of the recent energy

economics of reclaiming contaminated fuel now outweigh the practicalities of disposing of it at sea." The cost of reclaiming 6.2 million gallons, for example, would be no more than \$60,000. The savings on the 6.2 million gallons that the oilers pumped into the sea, therefore, would have been "approximately \$2.2 million.'

- As an additional consideration, discharging of contaminated petroleum products into the sea by the Navy is possibly doing damage to the ecological balance of nature.

# Autopsy Of The Collapse Of South Vietnam

By ROWLAND EVANS and ROBERT NOVAK

-WASHINGTON - An autopsy of the collapse of South Vietnam performed at a high level here points less to the widely presumed culprit, President Nguyen Van Thieu, and far more to a single command blunder in the field which combined with slumping U.S. military aid to produce irreversible tragedy. The autopsy was performed not by

Saigon embassy staffers closely associated with Thieu but by Washingtonbased officials not at all interested in his reputation who visited Vietnam after the collapse. Their story, cross-checked for accuracy and fully substantiated, helps explain why soldiers of the South Vietnamese Army (ARVN) now fight bravely at Xuan Loc and elsewhere but ran in disorder last month. The answer is not lack of courage, patriotism or even training but notoriously poor generalship which steadily weakened under pressure of diminishing U.S. aid. Failing support from Washington

along with Moscow's blank-check backing of North Vietnam, probably insured South Vietnam's eventual fall. But the macabre events of mid-March may have hastened Saigon's doom by years, in a manner magnifying the damage impact on U.S. policy.

Communist destruction of the 23rd ARVN Division in capturing Ban Me Thuot in the Central Highlands dramatized for Thieu the altered power balance. He determined then that his troops must retreat from exposed positions. But contrary to popular belief, he gave no precipitate order.

On March 13, Lt. Gen. Ngo Quang Truong, commanding the 1st Corps in



the North, flew to Saigon to confer with Thieu. Thieu ordered Truong to withdraw, abandoning Hue if necessary, but to make a stand at Da Nang. Truong agreed, adding he would defend Hue if possible

On March 14, Thieu summoned a top secret council of war (unknown to the U.S. embassy) at the military base of Cam Rahn Bay. Five generals attended: Thieu; Prime Minister Tran Thien Khiem; Gen. Cao Van Vien, chief of the general staff; Lt. Gen. Dang Van Quang, the president's military adviser; and Maj. Gen. Pham Van Phu, commander of the 2nd Corps headquartered at Pleiku in the Central Highlands.

Following Thieu's strategy, it was decided to abandon Pleiku and Kontum in the highlands - but certainly not withdraw all the way to Saigon. Rather. their plan was to regroup, then counterattack at Ban Me Thuot, seeking to end the hesitant Communist offensive. Just when Pleiku and Kontum would be abandoned was left open, a vagueness of historic importance. Four of those present thought the pullout was to take place gradually the last two weeks of

The bill goes now to the Sen-ate floor for debate. Only Sen. Mike McKinnon, D-Corpus Christi, failed to vote for the bill in Monday's committee session. He voted

The bill would establish a Public Utilities Commission, made up of three members appointed by the governor.
