

FIND RARE DISEASE

FIND RARE DISEASE Goldbwaite, Texas, Aug. 5. (UP)— It is believed that Mala fever has de-veloped in four cases in Brown and Comanche counties, the result of the bite of bugs in a cave occupied by goats. This is a very rare disease and but few physicians have had experi-ence with it. Two representatives of the state havith department, one from the state investock sanitary commis-sion and three physicians from Brown-wood came to Goldthwaite Tuesday and accompanied the Mills County health officer. Dr. J. M. Campbell. to the home of the patients in the ad-joining counties, where specimens of the blood from the patients and goats together with a number of the bugs, were taken to the state laboratory for analysis and examination.


