VIENTIANE - Laos (AP) - More than 170 Americans were evacuated from Vientiane on Saturday as U.S. embassy employes burned documents and angry Laotian emplayes demonstrated outside the embassy gate demanding payment of back wages.

About 350 Americans have been flown from Laos to Bangkok in the past two days while students, influenced by growing anti-Americanism apparently fueled by the Communist-led Pathet Lao, called for the ouster of the U.S. Agency for Inter-

national Development. The students held the AID compound for the fourth day to back their demands that the Americans leave, while Laotian AID employes demanded payment of their wages. The embassy declined to pay until the students leave the compound.

Most of the Americans flown out of the country were women and children. While U.S. Charge d'Affaires Christian A. Chapman said some non-essential documents were being "trimmed" and Marines could be seen burning papers, a







SAN ANTONIO, Tex. (AP) -Vietnamese prostitutes recruited by a former Saigon brothel operator are working military hases here, the San Antonio News says.

The madam, described only as an attractive, 39-year-old Vietnamese who fled when Saigon fell to the Communists, was brought to San Antonio by a "high ranking U.S. Army officer," the newspaper said Fri-

San Antonio is the site of four Air Force bases and Fort Sam Houston, headquarters of the 5th Army. The Defense Language Institute which trains many foreign students also is located here.

Near Kelly Base Most customers of the brothel in a residence near Kelly Air Force Base have been foreign military personnel and U.S. sol-diers who served in Vietnam, the newspaper said.

The News said it learned of the brothel from a military officer of a Middle East nation who is undergoing training

He said his men were "going wild" over several Vietnamese girls working the military bases.

San Antonio's military offi-cials apparently cannot place the brothel off-limits until a complaint is filed.

"Nobody has complained yet about this reported Vietnamese brothel," one military spokesman said.

Subject To Deportation Immigration and Naturalfzation Service regional director Joe Staley said Vietnamese prostitutes caught plying their trade would either be deported or put in custody.

"We give the refugees a lot of privileges, but one thing we have not waived: those who practice prostitution are not eligible for the program," he

The newspaper quoted also a 20-year-old Vietnamese girl who said she had refused an offer to work for the madam.

"I never want to wear my Vietnamese clothes again," she said, "One day I was dressed in my native clothes and I was downtown and all those soldiers followed me. I hate it. I just

Kleasen Says CIA After Him

By ROBERT HEARD
AUSTIN, Tex. (AP) — The state has called only six of its 48 witnesses in Robert Kleasen's Mormon missionary murder trial, and testimony resumes Tuesday with the expectation that the trial will last at least another week.

Among the prosecution's witnesses Friday was Dale Littleton, special agent for the Bureau of Alcohol, Tobacco and Firearms in the Treasury Department.

Guns, Knives Found
Littleton said when he arrested Kleasen half a mile from a church in Burnet on Nov. 5, Kleasen had a hunting knife on the front seat of his car, covered by a newspaper containing a story about the missing missionaries.

Under the seat on the right was a .357 magnum pistol, Littleton said, and in an unopened case in the back seat, within Kleasen's reach was a .22-caliber rifle.

Earlier that day, Littleton said, he and other officers searched Kleasen's trailer and nearby outbuildings and found two shotguns, "xix or seven" rifles, smokeless powder, casings and other equipment for making ammunition.

Watches Found Later
But they apparently didn't
find two bloody wrist watches
in a leather case in a trailer
drawer. The owner of a taxidermy shop in front of the
trailer, L. M. Rathbone, testified
he found the leather case "several days" after the search by
federal officers.

Kleasen contends any incriminating evidence found at or near his trailer was planted there. The CIA is out to get him, he says, because he quit the CIA to join the peace movement several years ago. CIA officials deny Kleasen ever worked for them.

Kleasen, 42, is accused of killing and then butchering on a taxidermy band saw Gary Darley, 20, of Simi Valley, Calif., and Mark Fischer, 19, of Milwaukee, Wis., on Oct. 28. He is being tried only in the Fischer slaying at this time.

300,000 Veterans To Receive June

WASHINGTON (AP) - At least 300,000 veterans due to re-ceive GI Bill benefit checks early next month probably will receive them late because Congress went on recess without appropriating the money, offi-

cials say. The \$425 million needed to cover the June checks for educational and training benefits is contained in a \$15-billion supplemental appropriations that is stalled because of House and Senate disagreement over a proposed \$700-million program to upgrade railroad tracks and facilities.

Congress left on its Memorial Day recess Thursday and will not reconvene until June 2, the day that Veterans Administration officials had planned to send the first vouchers for June benefits to the Treasury, which sends out the checks,



The commission goes through the routine of notifying the offending agency, but seldom is there any follow-up to find out whether the abuses have been corrected. Here are a few random samples from the confidential files:

- At the Federal Communications Commission, the investigators found that sloppy management was causing "a high loss rate of attorneys, excessive cost to the agency and poor morale in the professional staff with probable adverse effect on productivity."

- The Selective Service System now operating on a standby basis, was criticized for "excessive use of military officers in key positions."

- At the Renegotiation Board, the investigators discovered that the governthe regulations he is supposed to enforce ment negotiators were drawn largely from the industries with which they

- At Lampoc prison in California, the investigators discovered that "employment of Spanish-surnamed minorities is the area that is in need of most improvement."

- In Boston, the Civil Service team found the local drug enforcement office had a "complete absense of female and minority investigators." There were 'very few efforts toward recruiting women," the report charged.

The litany could go on but the point is clear. These abuses were uncovered, routinely noted and then locked in a file drawer. On Capitol Hill, Rep. John Moss, D-Calif., is taking steps to stop the deterioration of the civil service

Footnote: A Civil Service spokesman said there was nothing illegal or improper about the referrals made by Hampton and Spain.

In the "post-Watergate" atmosphere, however, they have issued new rules which forbid any referrals, he said. The commission is concerned about the abuses it turns up, a high-level CSC official told us, but simply does not have the power or resources to always nation which keepeth the truth may enter follow through.

"The Bitter Years," by Richard Petrow. In spring, 1940, when the British and Germans were fighting for control of the northern Norwegian port of Narvik, Petrow describes the following "With evacuation ruled out, the Germans moved to reinforce Narvik by

. . . Negotiations were also started with Sweden for permission to use the Swedish Railway to reinforce Narvik. Sweden at first refused, arguing that such a request violated her neutrality, but eventually Sweden buckled to German demands. The first train reached Narvik from Sweden carrying rations, medical supplies and a group of German radio technicians. More than 2/30 specialists of various kinds were brought to Navick through Sweden in the month of May, and close to eight hundred German merchant sailors and injured servicemen were evacuated from Narvik over the same route."

Elswhere in Petrow's book the reader can learn how oh-so-moral Sweden kept her borders closed to Jewish refugees-turning some away forcibly-until the tide shifted against Germany in 1943. Finland, of course, or several years fought with the Germans against the Russians. And as for Denmark and Norway, chronicler Petrow is blunt: "Denmark remained, in the spring of 1943, a country without an active resistance, headed by a government that viewed collaboration with Germany as the only sensible course of action." Moreover, "at no time, even when the tide of battle turned sharply against Germany, did the majority of Danes or Norwegians come out in active opposition to the Germans."

Maybe George Wallace was just essing. Maybe he really din't know what he was talking about. But there's also another possibility: That in remembering how German troops were allowed to pass through Sweden, and in saying that Scandinavia's record in World War was morally unimpressive, Governor Wallace displayed a better working knowledge of history than the Journalists who consider it chic to criticize him. 

WASHINGTON - There's a great

by young black thugs at "Human Kindness Day," with the Washington Monument providing the Maypole, left the biggest stink in this town since Watergate. For those who missed the accounts

of how some 500 young toughs (park police estimate) roamed through the crowd of 125,000 (whose human kindness juices were supposed to be flowing), wielding weapons ranging from fists to ice picks, well it was some outing. The score card now shows 627 com-

plaints of larceny, robbery and assault; 150 or 86 injuries requiring hospital treatment (depending on whose estimate you believe); 650 District of Columbia and park service police in the area and a remarkably small number of arrests

I had also assumed that by beginning the formal speeches with a congressman concerned strictly with political and economic questions (and I do not agree with his approach nor with aspects of his proposed energy bill), would give the rest of the speakers and panelists a chance to develop their approach in contrast to his. They tried to do just that, but their attempt was not followed by everyone present at the meeting.

Mr. Kevin-John McIntyre, for instance, gave a talk on James Fenimore "The Pioneers" and pointed out that the novel was prophetic in its criticism of the waste of resources, wrong laws and regulations, and a Natty Bumppo style of individualism which did not solve Bumppo's problems and cannot solve ours.

The Midland housewife-student spoke as a financially poor individual, and asked both the congressman and Mr. McIntyre to step down from clouds of theory and abstraction and learn to deal with the human problems at their doorstep and in their neighborhood.

Attorney Richard Abalos was critical of the oil producers, but even more critical of the congressman and Mr. McIntyre. In short, none of the speakers were in agreement, although (U.S. Rep. Bob) Eckhardt and McIntyre agreed on several important points, albeit for different reasons.

I had assumed, furthermore, that if we were to invite a congressman to such a meeting, he should be a Texan whose views on energy are well known both here and in Washington, D.C. Since Congressman Eckhardt insists on discussing energy in purely economic terms, yet is a candid and remarkably transparent individual, he was, in my view, no threat to the program or the ence. I have always thought the real threat to be the politician who comes here to say what you and I want to hear, then returns to Washington to vote otherwise.

The planning committee assumed, also, that energy is an issue for all to discuss privately and publicly: specialists and non-specialists, producer and consumer, educated and uneducated, rich and poor, blacks, chicanos or whites. It should have been clear from the programs in Midland and Odessa that most participants were non-specialists who knew little about wellhead costs or the stratigraphy of the Permian Basin. They were not even specialists on conscience; they merely tried to speak from the

conscience to the conscience. Much was left unsaid, although several independent producers and Mr. Ed Thompson of the Permian Basin Petroleum Association helped to make the open discussion a success by elo-

quently and effectively presenting both the information and the views of oil

Finally, I concluded after the first two reports in The Midland Reporter-Telegram on the energy meetings that since the reporter's perception of the meeting differed significantly from the written evaluations we have received from virtually every member of the audience, and that our tape recordings show that several statements purported to have been made were, in fact, not made, it would be in the interest of friendship and toleration not to make a fuss about these differences.

In one respect, at least, we guessed right. The meeting in Midland was spirited, polite and amicable. I wish more Midlanders would have been present to observe Mr. Ed Thompson in action — an extraordinarily gracious and congenial man, especially with those whose views are different from his own.

I wish, moreover, that more oil people had been present to inform the audience on the day-to-day risks and anxieties of the producer. Personal invitations were sent but with little success. I was especially sorry that the mayor did not respond to our personal invitation to attend the Midland meeting.

In conclusion, let me plead the obvious: that in a democracy in which there are honest differences of opinion, toleration and fundamental honesty are basic. I hope this letter will help to correct some of the recent misrepresentations of the energy meetings.

Texans Ripped

AUSTIN - One week the House of Representatives was in session 59 hours, Speaker Bill Clayton announced proudly on a Saturday afternoon.

By contrast, the Senate had been in session only 139 hours since they came to town in January.

Sit and watch the House of Representatives and you will see the difference from what goes on at the other end of the State Capitol.

The House will be voting on the same proposition a dozen times, in slightly varied form. The Senate will have worked out its differences, or at least reached a meeting of the minds to such an extent that once a bill is brought up, odds are 50 to 1 that it will pass.

The House is full of "chubbers." the legislative slang term given to those who waste time, hour after hour, by useless points of order. By wasting the time, they are able to prevent action on whatever legislation is down the list of bills to be considered.

It is a fine way to kill bills you do not want, even if a huge majority of the House would vote for the measure if they ever got a chance.

A good example of time wasting came the other day when Rep. Bob Davis of Irving appeared on the House floor without a tie. House rules require members to wear a coat and tie during

Four times, Speaker Pro Tempore Dick Slack of Pecos "sustained the point of order." But Davis kept taking off his tie. Finally Slack growled, on the fourth Kaster point of order, which was accompanied by a request that Davis be removed from the House by the sergeant

"Put on your tie, Mr. Davis." Davis did, and the business of lawmaking was resumed, half an hour or so wasted. And the "chubbers" turned to other ways to delay the process. That one had worn off its humor.

As a result of this sort of thing, committees which are supposed to meet at 2:30 p.m. often meet at 7 p.m. Those which are supposed to meet at 7:30 p.m. do not get quorums because the House has stayed in session until 7 p.m. and members dash off to get dinner before returning.

Again, the result is that legislative proposals do not even get considered. Witnesses who have waited since 2:30 to testify find there is no one to testify

"Chubbers" also include wise crackers who make comical points of order, or ask parliamentary questions, and use humor to waste away the hours

many important matters of state policy never get considered, Either they are lost in committee, or they are lost in the pile of bills on the House calendar which are never reached for consideration.

Look over the list of things you can already see will be left undone by the session which winds up June 2. Pressing problems of reform in school finance, child care, crime and delinquency, prison reform, energy policy, insurance reform, tax inequity and natural resource policy seem certain to be left on the shelf,

Mainly, the issues which will be tended to are those with well-organized lobbies which are able to focus attention, drag members to committee meetings, and watch from the galleries to see that their measures are not "chubbed" to death.

The delinquent child, the mounting energy crisis, the insurance buyers have no lobbyists to press their causes through to completion. They have their legislative sponsors who cry without effect of the need to do this or that. But it takes organization to get one's problems handled in the mighty few hours of actual lawmaking available to the legislators.

There is really no cure for it, because legislators have rights to say what they please, except to elect legislators who will use what time they have more judiclously, and give the other legislator a chance to have his say, too.





In order for fruit set to occur, pollen must be fransferred from the male flower to the female flower. This is usually accomplished by inascts and the most common insect is the honey bee. If the pollen is not transferred from the male to the female flower, then the squash plant will fail

The female flowers of the quash plant are readily idenbecause they have the small immature fruit directly behind the showy petals. The male blooms have no such fruit chind the petals. Generally, but not always, the first blooms to appear on the squash plant are the male blooms and since they do not set fruit, will naturally fall off. If female and male blooms are open on the plant at the same time and fruit set falls to occur, you can bet the problem is lack of pollination.

With a large majority of the vegetable gardens already lanted across the county, home gardeners are encouraged to gardens this fall or next spring. Although there are optimum storage conditions for different vegetable seeds depending upon various factors, most vegetable seed can be stored quite satisfactorily in the home refrigerator (40 to 50 degrees F) for periods of 2 to 5 years. For home storage of vegetable seeds, the seed should be packaged and placed in an airtight container such as a coffee rean with a tight fitting lid or a glass jar and set in the 3504 W.
