John's Hat Hasn't Landed In Ring Yet

John Connally has yet to throw his pearl-gray Stetson into the presidential ring, his eager fingers already seem to be gripping the brim. There's a chance that Connally may choose to run his the 1976 GOP primaries, but friends say he's also interested in leading a "third force" because both major parties have falled. Chalk up another man who sees an opportunity in parity disintegration.

Blecause the former Texas governor has had at least one private recent meeting with Ronald Reagan, it many be misleading to suggest that the two men are possible 1976 rivals. Even so, there are some clear ideological distinctions between Reagan and Connally that could grow in importance as Republican (and also thirdparity) politics heat up.

Pin-striped and well-groomed, John Connally looks like a human version of a Lincoln Continental. But undemeath the fancy tailoring, there's a populist instinct in ex-Democrat Conaally that goes back to his rural Texas hophood. Northern Republican conservatives take their economic conescuatism very seriously. Southerners, ong the other hand, especially those

politicians who have been state governors, take economic conservatism with a grain of salt - they know there is a time for new roads, easy money and anti-banker talk.

As governor, John Connally was a bit of a populist (not often, mind you - just occasionally). As a would be presidential candidate, he already is divorcing himself from the orthodox conservative tight-money policies of Federal Reserve Chairman Arthur Burns (supported by Ronald Reagan). Connally also favors activist, even statist economics in contrast to Reagan's deregulatory, don't-interferewith-the-marketplace mentality. In fiscal policy, though, both Connally and Reagan agree that Gerald Ford's budget deficit is too big.

In defense policy, Connally and Reagan have few differences. They both call for increased military preparedness and a strong foreig policy. This is one area where tradiional conservation and populist conservatism pretty much agree (although George Wallace hesitates over a hard line towards North Korea, for example because he knows that the man in the street doesn't want another Aman

Then there is the question of anti-Establishment imagery so vital to populist appeal, George Wallace has buckets of it and Ronald Reagan just a thimble or two. As for John Connally he is trying to profit from his acquittal of bribery charges by (1) arguing that he was unjustly accused for political reasons and (2) repackaging himself as a victim rather than apostle of the Watergate mentality. In his autumn speaking tour, Connally will attack the abuses of the grand jury system, the FBI and the Internal Revenue Service. In each case, he will call for reform to protect individual liberties (implying that his were violated). And in each case, he will be striking an "antiament" posture.

Appearing on "Meet the Press" on June 1, Connally declined to call himself a thoroughgoing conservative
— instead, he chose the term
"moderate conservative." The Texan is conservative on issues where neopopulists are conservative - like social policy, defense and a strong international posture. But he doesn't want to be hung with the "economic conservative" image in a period of hard times, tight money and 9 per cent unemployment. Thus, when you put Reagan, Connally and Wallace on a "New Right" spectrum, Rengan comas out as the old-style (mostly economic) Conservative, Wallace is the anti-Establishment populist con-servative, and John Connally is in the middle

Anyone who wants to understand the dynamics of the new forces gathering in national politics can do worse than study the evolution of these three men. Reagan, Wallace and Connally all began their careers as New Deal Democrats. Two have since become Republicans and the third has run for President as an Independent all in protest against the liberal course of the national Democratic Party, Add them up, and you have a pretty good picture of the importance (and also the complexity) of the "New Right."

The Washington Merry-Go-Round

WASHINGTON - We began a series of columns last January exposing malfeasance, misfeasance and nonfeasance inside the Drug Enforcement Administration. We charged that internal dissension had crippled the agency and had weakened the war against narcotics.

Our articles triggered a series of events which has culminated in the forced resignation of Administrator John Bartels. He was asked to resign by Deputy Atty. Gen. Harold Tyler.

Bartels resisted at first, saying he needed time "to sleep on it." He immediately got in touch with one of his predecessors, Myles Ambrose, now an influential Washington attorney, who telephoned the White House in Bartels'

But the White House refused to save Bartels. The next morning, he met again with Tyler and asked for still more time to decide. A few hours later, Tyler notified Bartels that his time was up.

Our sources say Bartels was bounced to take the sting out of hearings scheduled this week by Sen. Henry Jackson, D.-Wash. His subcommittee has been investigating the charges we raised in our columns. We disclosed, for example,

- Top narcotics officials had been so busy investigating one another that they had little time to cope with the dope dealers.

 Despite record high budgets, DEA had been unable to stem the flow of heroin into the country. An estimated 125,000 new addicts, we reported, became hooked in the past year alone.

- The handling of internal corruption cases was sloppy. We quoted which warned that the number of

unresolved corruption cases leaves "the agency in an embarrassing situation."

- We reported that corrupt DEA agents had been caught dealing in the drugs they were supposed to be sup-

- As early as 1960, the drug enforcement apparatus maintained close ties with the Central Intelligence Agency. DEA has 64 former CIA employes on its payroll and another 13 narcotics agents were trained by the CIA at its supersecret counterespionage school, we reported.

- And we revealed that the drug agents maintained love traps for the CIA in New York City and San Francisco. Foreign diplomats were lured into these apartments by prostitutes in the pay of the CIA, which filmed the sexual adventures through hidden one-way mirrors and later tried to blackmail the victims into becoming informants.

We began our investigation of the DEA in November 1974, two months before we published the first story. Our associate, Bob Owens, confronted the DEA with charges that Bartels was covering up an investigation of an assistant, Vincent Promuto.

Thereafter, DEA kept a sharp eye on us. One internal memo warned that we were "familiar" with "the Promuto from a confidential management study, matter." Later, Bartels drafted a fourpage, single-spaced response to one of

our columns and ordered every DEA employe to read it.

From Thailand to Turkey, DCA agents also were instructed to make sums Bartels' opun was published in the local newspapers. The DEA office in Theiland gave up, explaining in a memo that "none of the Bangkok newspapers subscribe to Jack Anderson's columns." But in most places, Bartels' orders were charges, it seemed, had priority over fighting the drug amugglers. (The Seattle regional director assured

Burtels that "all supervisors were held responsible to insure that each employe reed and initialed" the four-page opus. In Boston, the regional director "personally read Mr. Bartels' letter to sill Boston regional office agents." In Detroit, the regional director boasted flust he had submitted the letter to the Detroit Free Press under his own

And the chief of the New York drug task force wrote to Bartels: "We have read several articles by columnist Jack Anderson which have been less than complimentary to the Drug Enforcement Administration. . . Your accomplish and professionalism are deserving of accolades, not criticism."

a collision course President Luis Echeverria and the predominantly socialistic advisers around him are determined that the government should own and run business, industry and agriculture in

The Businessmen's Coordinating Council, a newly formed group that speaks for chambers of commerce, for industrialists, bankers and most other sectors of private enterprise in Mexico, is trying to slow the plunge toward socialism.

The struggle between government and business in Mexico is nothing new. It has been going on for decades, since before the Revolution of 1910.

It reached an earlier peak during the presidency of the late Gen. Lazaro Cardenas, who ran Mexico from 1934

Cardenas is chiefly famed for nationalizing the predominantly foreignowned oil industry in 1938 and setting a precedent that in recent years has spread elsewhere in the oil world.

But after Cardenas left office in 1948, and what with the start of World War. II, the Mexican Revolution, in the words of a Mexican political observer, "got down off its high horse."

For one thing, Mexico, and Cardenas, too, wanted to collaborate with the United States, the Soviet Union and other allies in the battle against fascism.

For another, the more moderate presidents who succeeded Cardenas seemed to feel that Mexico had more to learn and more to gain by following the U.S. economic model than by dabbling in the socialism that quite obviously had not worked any enviable

wenders in the Soviet Union. That is not to say that Mexico abandoned its interest in government

ownership of business and industry.

Quite the contrary. By 1964 the Mexican government owned 82.2 per cent of the top 30 enterprises in the country. That included the national railroads, the light and power companies, Petroleos Mexicanos which is the national oil monopoly, chemical plants, banks and other financial institutions, steel, textile and lumber mills, airlines, distribution of basic consumer goods, mining and

smelting, warehousing and telephones. Private Mexican interests controlled 13.9 per cent of the biggest firms, and foreign private interests, 3.9 per cent.

Those figures are somewhat misleading, though. There are very important concentrations of ownership in single families and small groups in Mexico. But as their holdings often are

incorporated each as individual corporations, none of which is big enough to figure in the nation's top 30 firms, their real economic influence is not so evident.

In any case, over the three decades between the end of Cardenas' term and 1970, when President Echeverria took office, Mexican government and private enterprise managed to live together without any great problems.

Echeverria, though, came on as great surprise. Although he joined the government while still a law student at the National University in Mexico City in the mid-1940s, there was nothing in his history to indicate that he would try to change or upset the Mexican establishment.

In fact, his record as interior minister during the administration of President Gustavo Diaz Ordaz might have been interpreted as an indication that Echeverria was a strict law-andorder man. Echeverria is still blamed for the massacre of Tlatelolco, where, in October, 1968, scores if not hundreds of students and other leftist-led

demonstrators lost their lives in clashes with Mexican army troops virtually on the eve of the Olympic Games in Mexico.

But, as president, Echeverria has leaned heavily on his socialistic-minded advisers, at least in the economic and foreign policy areas.

At home, to judge by the statements of some of those Marxists who whipped up the confrontation in Tlatelolco and escaped with their lives, the Echeverria administration is as repressive of political dissent as any before it.

In the foreign policy field, though, Echeverria has moved to the left. One evidence of that is the visit he made to Chile during the period of the Marxist government of the late President Salvador Allende. Later he was Allende's host in Mexico. Since overthrow of the Chilean Marxist regime, in September, 1973, Mexico has opened its doors to hundreds of Chilean exiles, chiefly Marxist intellectuals and former Allende government officials. The late President Allende's widow and his sister and their grown children now make their homes in Mexico. The Chilean Marxist influence on Mexican political pro-

paganda also is on the rise. Possibly what triggered the latest show of concern of Mexican private enterprise about the way the Echeverria government is going was the announcement by the governing Institutional Revolutionary Party (PRI) that, if it has its way, there will be no change in government policies during

the next presidential term, 1976-1982. Jesus Reyes Heroles, former National University history professor who turned to politics, now PRI boss, not only proclaimed that the "pendular law is antihistorical," but also announced that "a basic plan of government" will be drawn up that will "guarantee..the consolidation and advance of the realizations of the regime of President Echeverria." To some observers, that was

reminiscent of the "basic program of government" that the Marxista prepared for Allende in Chile and which followed in an attempt to impose socialism on that South American country.

The pendular law is tight phenomena in which Mexican governments tend to swing from one extreme to the other. Presumably it was the hope that Mexico's next government would pull back from what orthodox economists consider the Echeverria excesses that had been keeping big business in Mexico silenti

But when the Businessmen's Coordinating Council sent a delegation to meet with President Echeverria and presented him with a declaration of principles that included defenses of private property, private busin private initiative and other such points, the businessmen got nowhere.
