

AUSTIN (AP) - Gov. Dolph Briscoe chopped \$27 million out of Texas' twoyear state budget Saturday after signing into law bills creating the state's first public utilities commission and regulating the strip mining of coal, lignite and uranium.

In addition to erasing numerous specific appropriations in the budget, Briscoe vetoed an entire series of 136 construction projects at 18 colleges and also retoed 17 other bills.

The 17 included a bill to make the Texas Water Quality Board a six-member citizens board, rather than a mix of citizens and state agency heads. Also rubbed out by the governor's veto was a proposal to change city charters by submitting petitions with 10 per cent of the city's qualified vot-

**WASHINGTON** — Defense Secretary James Schlesinger has been trying to send a message to Pyongyang. He wants to put North Korea's Premier Kim II-sung on notice, according to competent sources, that Kim may risk nuclear retaliation if he attempts to revive the

Schlesinger has placed increased em-phasis lately on limited nuclear warfare as a military option. In the backrooms of the Pentagon, he has suggested striking North Korean targets with tactical nuclear weapons if the Communist forces attempt to cross the 38th parallel.

Schlesinger would like to get this word to the recklessly ambitious Kim who for months has been tunneling under the demilitarized zone and now has deplayed armored forces for a possible

Schlesinger has issued public warnings of a direct attack upon North Korean military forces if a conflict should flare up. He has been careful, however, not to mention nuclear retaliation in

The cautious warnings have had the approval of President Ford, who hoped to deter Pyongyang without alarming Peking and Moscow. The President has taken pains also not to stir up Congress. He has given private assurances to con-gressional leaders that he will not order U.S. forces into combat in Korea without

formal congressional approval. Meanwhile, Schlesinger has pushed the development of mobile nuclear weapons as the best defense against future Koreans and Vietnams. The Strategic Air Command has sent top-secret briefing teams to explain the new nuclear policy to homber crews and missile wings. In military shorthand, the secret briefings are called NUWEP, which means Nu-

Some presidential advisers regard a public, overall U.S. settlement plan as essential before the Geneva conference, under U.S. and Soviet patronage, is called back into session as a last-ditch gafety net to prevent the inflamed Middle East from falling back into another shooting war.

Such a U.S. plan would likely call for Israeli withdrawal not only from the Egyptian Sinal but from most of the Syrian Golan heights and the Palestinian West Bank seized from Jordan in 1967. A strong possibility is perceived here that Egypt, Syria and Jordan would underwrite such an overall American plan - but Israel would not. Such a line-up would weaken Israel in the place that counts - U.S. voters.

The second Ford high card is the Israeli request for \$2.59 billion in military and economic aid. Ever since the much hallyhooed "reassessment" of U.S. policy following the aborted March mediation effort, the President has postponed decisions on how much of this massive aid he will ask Congress to vote. He wants first to know how forthcoming Israel will be.

But such presidential pressure tacties have rarely counted for much in Israel. and the election-eve year of 1975 is not the ideal climate for them. That explains the deepening pessimism here, and the renewal of cold realism that little Israel is more than a match for American Presidents and Secretaries of

The reason, I suspect, is that Washington revels in its politics - the only game and only industry in town when the Redskins aren't playing with such devoted fascination that the sight of a reincarnated Mr. Lincoln seems entirely within the realm of possibility. To stop the gentleman and question his purpose ("What are you, Mister, some kinda nut?") would be both disrespectful and unreasonable. Certainly it would ensure that no more dinner invitations from Mary Todd would be forthcoming.

As a newcomer to Washington, it took me a few weeks to learn that there is no escaping the game. If you don't play politics, you don't belong. Even the cab drivers shut you out conversationally when you come up blank on the pros and cons of the energy bill in the Ways and Means Committee.

Return of the Trolley? Americans who reluctantly went off their trolleys several decades ago may soon be climbing happily back on again. The street car, dispossessed by the automobile, is threatening a comeback.

"Light rail vehicles," as transit authorities call the modern electric trolleys, could give buses a run for your money. No air pollution. No leapfrogging over the streets or bunching into traffic jams. No hissing and jolting to murderous stops. Trolleys don't burn fuel when they pause. They can be illuminated or airconditioned with relatively little power.

Disciplined by rails below or cables overhead, trollevs go their decorous but speedy way. Many commuters who consider buses too plebeian think street cars are fun. As for cost, trolley lines can be built for about \$3 million a mile, compared to the \$10-to-\$40-million cost of subways and elevated railroads.

This month in Philadelphia, a national conference will be conducted by the U.S. Department of Transportation to explore the streetcar's potential for U.S. cities.

The Astro management has a real knack of winning pennants-for other teams, and it is no small wonder that Housfon has the worst record in major league haseball. They have worked long and hard to accomplish the goal.

There are no major league records recorded as which team leads the league in good trades and bad trades, but the Astron have to own the title hands down in the latter cate-

Since the glorious days of the old Colt .45's, Houston has sold or traded away the possibilities of a couple of world championships, and if you're not convinced, just take a look at some of the past trading bonanzas of the Astros. It's a

It all started in 1965 when the Astron sold Jerry Grote to the New York Mets for the going walver price. Groto became an all-star in 1960 and helped the Mets to a world crown in 1969. Houston, on the other hand, has listed catching an one of their worst problems since that time. But then came 1968, and the Astros outdid themselves

again. They traded pitcher Mike Cuellar to Baltimore for

outfielder Curt Blefary and then sent pitcher Dave Glusti and Dave Adlesh to St. Louis for catchers John Edwards and Quellar went on to pitch Baltimore to two divisional titles and has had three 20-win years, including a 34-8 mark in 1970, and Giusti became one of the top relief men in baseball for the Pittsburgh Pirates. Blefary and Smith contributed nothing to the Astro program and Edwards was already past his prime although he did a respectable job—no pennant in-

(Then in 1909, the Astros sent the popular Rusty Stanb (the franchise at the time) to Montreal for Don Cleudenon and Jesus Alou. Stanb had had three .300 plus seasons at fourton and later helped the Mets to another pennant. Clencom refused to report to Houston and Alou was used sparingly as a pinch hitter. In 1971, the Astros pulled another boner. John Mayherry was traded to Kansas City for pitchera Jim York and Lance Clemons. Mayberry proceeded to hit 398 and drive in 108 runs in 1972, and hasn't slowed since. York pitched 36 tunings for Houston for an 0-1 record and Clemons was sent to the

Last year, Jimmy Wynn, the toy canon, was traded to Los Angeles for pitcher Claude Osteen. Osteen didn't last the season with the Astros and Wynn was simply super for the Dodgers, and is having another good year this season.

The only good trade I can find for the Astros came in

1970 when they got shortstop Roger Metzger from St. Louis for shortstop Hector Torres.

Through it all, however, Housian has managed to build players through their miner league system with the likes of Greg Gress, Bob Watson, Dong Rader and Cesar Cedeno. 

Firpe Fight Dempsey's sensational fight with Luis Angel Firpo of South America may never be equal-led for sheer drama. Sports writers called Firpo "The Wild" Bull of the Pampas," and he was all of that, an inch taller than Jack and 30 pounds heavier, Fans who packed the Polo Grounds on Sept. 14, 1923, saw the Wild Bull nearly floor Dempsey with his first punch, only to go down himself six or seven

Then, with about 10 seconds left, Firpo sent Dempsey flying through the ropes and onto the press section typewriters. Willing hands pushed the champ back into the ring just before the bell sounded. Kearns located the smelling salts and got Deropsey back on earth for the second round, Jack nailed Firpo with two lefts to the jaw, and the fight was over after 57 seconds of Round 2.

"Doc" Kearns had been a great hand at arranging big payoffs for Dempsey, including \$500,000 for the Firpo fight. He also was a great spender. # National Geographic To Print Magazine Just For Children

WASHINGTON - Gilbert M. Grosvenor says that his 5-year-old son reads the National Geographic. "Sometimes he reads it upside down, sometimes he reads it right side up."

But for the child who demands that his reading matter conform more strictly to his reading habits --- or who does not exhibit the loyalty that comes of being the editor's son - the National Geographic Society is planning to publish

World, a monthly magazine aimed at children between the ages for 8 and 12, will begin publication in September, Grosvenor announced. The Society is now taking orders for subscriptions, which will cost \$4.85 in the United States, \$5.50 in Canada and Mexico and \$5.85

Subscribing does not confer membership in the National Geographic Society, and membership is not necessary for buying a subscription.

The subject matter will be natural history, but there will be no scaled-down versions of National Geographic stories, Grosvenor said. Rather, National Geographic writers and photographers have been asked to be on the lookout for World stories whenever they travel on National Geographic assignments, and will develop them separately. Ralph Grav is the editor of World.

as he was of the 56-year-old National Geographic School Bulletin, which it replaces. World has its own staff but will use the National Geographic resources, including its vast photographic library. The Society is 80 years old. It will be about the size of Time

magazine and will contain no advertising. In addition to the articles and pictures, there will be puzzles, mazes, cardboard models and posters.

The first print order for World is 750,000 copies. The National Geographic has nine million subscribers, and Grosvenor said that surveys have in-

dicated that there are 35 million readers of those copies.

Prospective subjects are albinism in animals, cobras, a seal who commutes between the Boston Aquarium and a summer home in Rockport, Maine, water safety, a Siberian child and gymnastics. When the magazine runs a maze game, hints for completing it rapidly will be scattered through the magazine, so that the child who reads it carefully will have the best chance.

The first issue has a wall-sized portrait of a wild chimpanzee folded nside, and four pages of punch-out cardboard which can be assembled into a somewhat angular globe. Another issue will have tucked inside a scaled down cardboard model of a pterosaur, a 65million-year-old flier the size of a jet

Grosvenor said he was disappointed that the testing, which was done over the last year, showed that children were unwilling to do magazine-suggested projects for which all the materials were not supplied. An article telling what could be made out of old bleach bottles was a failure because the test-readers weren't willing to make the effort to find old bleach bottles.

"I don't know whether this means that they're lazy or we're unskilled in the way we presented the idea," said Grosvenor. At any rate, the project suggestions in the magazine will not require extra supplies.

Nor will the staff honor requests from children "who write in, 'I'm suppose to do a paper on Chincoteague Island and would you please send me the paper.' We will direct them to sources," he said, which is what the Society has done traditionally for adults who request graduate theses.

At the least, Grosvenor hopes, it will encourage children to spend some of their leisure time reading instead of watching television.

That's why, even today, so many of our working class people refuse to accept the excuses of white liberals and upper-class blacks for black crimes. How can we accept poverty as an excuse for hurting each other when so many of us are poor? If we did that, we'd wipe each other out."

Pretender Barred From Reentering Spain By Franco

Agence France-Presse MADRID - Prince Don Juan de Borbon, who last week reasserted his claim to the Spanish throne, has been forbiden to enter Spain for the time being, an informed source revealed here today.

The prince, whose son Prince Juan Carlos has been officially designated as the next king of Spain by Gen. Francisco Franco, made the claim during a speech Saturday. The Spanish overnment's ban was conveyed to him by the Spanish ambassador to Portugal, who visited Don Jaun in Estoril near Lisbon Wednesday.

According to the source, the Spanish government will allow Don Jaun to send a crew to Palma in Majorca to bring back his yacht Guralda II from its moorings there. Don Juan had several meetings on the Baleark Islands with Spanish opposition politicians before delivering his speech at a dinner given by his followers to mark his 62nd birthday, which falls Friday.
