excuse: "I excuses: "I was late for work." "It's inconvenient." "I didn't know I had to stop." "Nobody else stopped. Why else stopp
should I?

Let's look at these excuses for a moment. Being late for work is
certainly a hassle, but you'll be even later when the police stop to ticket you for not yielding to a school bus. And while it's true, traffic flows better when there are fewer interrup-
tions, the inconvenience of stopping for a bus waiting for a child to board or leave is worth the life it will save.
Since it's possible some Texans may not
be up on the law, here it be up on the law, here it
is in a nutshell. From either direction, if you
approach a school bu with flashing red lights, you must stop and not pass until the bus has started moving, the bus driver signals you to pass or the red lights are no longer doesn't require drivers doesn't require drivers
