WASHINGTON (AP) - The woman who allegedly attempted to assassinate President Ford in San Francisco Monday night asked a San Francisco police inspector a day earlier to place her in cus-tody because she might start "testing the system," Sen. Joseph M. Montoya said today.

The New Mexico Democrat, who heads the Senate appropriations subcommittee which handles Secret Service funds, said it was this information that prompted the Secret Service to interview Sara Jane Moore Sunday night but that she was neither held in custody nor placed under surveillance.

"The fact is that they did not follow up," Montoya said as he announced that his subcommittee would begin hearings next week on the San Francisco incident and an earlier alleged assassination attempt against President Ford in Sacramento on Sept. 5.

Montoya said his information on Mrs. Moore had been supplied by the Secret Service. "It is my feeling from what I

know that the President should have more protection," Montoya said, adding that from

Montoya noted that neither Mrs. Moore nor Lynette Fromme, arrested and charged in the Sacramento incident, was listed on the 47,000-name computer listing of persons considered possibly dangerous to the President.

He said the Secret Service reported that Mrs. Moore was "an informant for both the Federal Bureau of Investigation and the Bureau of Alcohol, Tobacco and Firearms of the Deing as an informant for the latter agency "on cases involving gun trafficking."

A memorandum read by Montoya, which had been prepared by his staff based on information from the Secret Service, said that on Sunday night, after her arrest for carrying a revolver, Mrs. Moore "phoned an inspector of the San Francisco police department and requested that he retain her in

"The inspector knew Mrs. Moore as an informant and asked her what the charge for continued custody could be." the memorandum continued. "She replied that she had been a part of the protest movement for some time and she just might start 'testing the sys-

According to the memorandum, "upon receiving this information, the inspector alerted the Secret Service to interview Mrs. Moore late Sunday night.

"During the interrogation, there was no indication of Mrs. Moore showing an interest in the President or presenting a danger to him," it added, not-

ing that "although released from custody by the San Francisco police, she was not placed under surveillance by the Secret Service."

A major focus of the probe will be "whether or not we will need additional Secret Service personnel," Montoya said, noting his panel had approved the en-tire request made by the Secret Service this year.

Asked about the call for "a good old shaking up over there" made by Sen. Ernest F. Hollings, D-S.C., a subcommittee member, Montoya said, "I'm not prepared to say that."





## **Eyes Reveal Emotions**

NEW YORK (AP) - Not only is vision man's most valuable sense, but his eyes reveal how he feels, believes Dr. Eckhard Hess, professor of biopsychology and cognition in the Department of Behavioral Sciences at the University of Chicago

Fifteen years ago Hess founded a discipline he named pu-pillometrics, which teaches that the size of a person's pupils correlates with his emotions.

"The pupil of the eye is like a piece of the brain sticking out, so that the behavior of the eye gives an accurate view of the gives an accurate view of the way a person feels," Hess explained in an interview. "To understate it, when people look at something they like, which they find appealing and interesting, their pupils will get larger; the pupils constrict when they find something to be dull, distasteful or negative.

"Eye language is a form of body language, except the eyes are very difficult to control."

The doctor, who took his medical degrees at Johns Hopkins University, notes that many beneficial uses have been found for pupillometrics, ranging from pretest marketing of commercial products to civic planning to political campaigning to fashion designing to social psychology. cial psychology.

"My real hope," he says, "is that pupillometrics will be used to measure the effectiveness of different types of medical therapy. This will be the most valuable to humanity."

He cited rehabilitation programs for the mentally retarded, drug addicts and alco-holics. "Pupillometrics could be effective in alcoholism therapy by measuring an alcoholic's pupillary response to liquor. In one study it was found that patients who were released after registering large pupils in response to the smell of alcoholic beverages in the last weeks of treatment were readmitted shortly thereafter, while patients who had shown a loss of that response — whose pu-pils constricted when faced with alcohol — had the highest rate of nonreadmittance."

Hess fears one possible mis-use of his discipline: forced in-vestigation. "There is a prob-lem of its potential abuse in the invasion of privacy," he warns. "Periodically I have been asked by governmental and private agencies to use pupillometrics as a lie detector. Each time I have refused.

"There is one safeguard, nowever," he adds. "It is very tough to get pictures of a per-son's pupils without his know-ing it. If that's possible I'd like to know how. It would resolve many experimental handi-



Out with Benn went pie-in-the-sky plans for rapid liquidation of the non-nationalized industrial sector of the economy, government underwriting of runaway wages and acceleration toward near-total government control of every aspect of the economy (even now 59 per cent of the gross domestic product is tied into the public sector).

Benn's personal manifesto is a clear warning to Wilson that if the politically bold course he has chosen fails to rescue Britain, Benn will make his move to capture the Labor Party.

That move would come against the backdrop of a highly-organized effort by the left-wing of the Labor Party, including overt Marxists, to sack Labor members of Parliament deemed insufficiently activist in pushing radical-left politics.

The celebrated case of Overseas Development Minister Reg Prentice, blackballed for reelection by the radical-left leadership of his local constituency, is well known. Other moderate Labor members of Parliament are targets for similar extinction by the far left which is now engaged in a major effort to take over local party leaderships as the first step in a purge of moderates.

Benn's manifesto pointing to future in which the British economy would come under "workers' control is only indirectly related to this political battle to take over and radicalize the Labor Party by controlling its candidates for office. The two developments portend profound political change within the party -But only if the new agreement between the Wilson government and the labor unions breaks down.

The first, essential step of that agreement - a \$12 ceiling on wage increases over the next year - took 18 months of patient lobbying of labor leaders by Wilson and Healey. The next steps may be much harder: reform of Britain's antiquated industry; and ending senseless restrictive practices of labor unions and their stranglehold over virtually every aspect of management decision-mak-

If Wilson's government can accomplish these Herculean tasks, absolutely vital investment capital should begin to flow back into Britain's over-aged industrial plant. There is plenty of it for the private sector stashed away in London banks — but industry, fearful of future nationalization plans and Wilson's ability to control the unions, won't invest.

Thus, the future is mortgaged to the performance and credibility of Wilson, Healey & Co. The far-left has been adroitly outflanked. Benn's political manifesto and the battle of labor's radical wing to seize local party organizations will be non-issues if Wilson succeeds. If not, Wilson's party will lunge leftward into a new orbit with profound implications for the



Senator Cotton, we have learned, had a dental plate repaired and reportedly had a new one made. And Rep. Edward Boland, D-Mass., has had extensive gum invigoration work.



There is plenty of it for the private sector stashed away in London banks — but industry, fearful of future nationalization plans and Wilson's ability to control the unions, won't invest.

Thus, the future is mortgaged to the performance and credibility of Wilson, Healey & Co. The far-left has been adroitly outflanked. Benn's political manifesto and the battle of labor's radical wing to seize local party organizations will be non-issues if Wilson succeeds. If not, Wilson's party will lunge leftward into a new orbit with profound implications for the

## The Washington Merry-Go-Round

WASHINGTON - Members of Congress, newly blessed with a salary boost and already loaded with fringe benefits, have for years been chiseling the Navy for free dental care.

The roster of legislators illegally getting root-canal work, deluxe fillings, dental surgery and even new plates reads like the leadership pages of the Congressional Directory.

Senate Majority Leader Mike Mansfield, D-Mont., Sen. Mark Hatfield, R-· Ore., and ex-Sen. Norris Cotton, R-N.H., are only a few of the solons whose smiles reflect free custom care at the top-notch Navy Yard clinic.

Former Health, Education and Welfare Secretary Robert Finch, who might have gotten bootleg care from canal. his own departmental dentists, chose instead to patronize the Navy. Even prominent foreign diplomats were sneaked into the clinic.


Navy regulations, and human decency, require dentists to take care of patients in a true emergency. Such appears to be the case when Sen. William Proxmire, D-Wis., went to the clinic after he broke his tooth on a prune pit in a Senate restaurant.

Sen. Charles Percy, R-III., also feels he comes under the emergency rule because he needed a filling replaced and wasn't scheduled to see his regular dentist in Chicago for a month.

NEW YORK - "With all the drunks, pickpockets and call girls," news dealer Edmund Donnellon relates with a wave of his hand toward New York's Madison Square Garden at 32nd and 7th Avenue, "the Democratic delegates are likely to get lost in the shuffle around here." The selection of this city by the

Democrats for their 1976 national convention has as many political perils for the party as physical perils. New York Mayor Abraham Beame

will do as much as possible to clean up the crime-ridden section near the Madison Square Garden where the Democratic convention will be held.

However, it remains to be seen whether he can do much about New York's deepening fiscal crisis. Both crime and the city's fiscal difficulties make the selection of New York by the Democrats a political target for the Republicans. It can be asserted. for example, that the Democrats have appropriately chosen to meet in a city where their philosophy of government has dominated for decades, and look at the mess. Does the nation want to follow New York under the Democrats?

What should be of even greater concern to the Democrats, however, is the expected fight that will doubtlessly be waged among the various party factions at the convention. In fact, what has been happening in Texas may offer a forecast of the furious convention floor fight

fight among Texas Democrats is U.S. Sen. Lloyd Bentsen, seeking the presidential nomination while simultaneously running for reelection. He can do this because he lobbied through the Texas Legislature a special bill permitting him to run for his Senate seat and also enter the Texas presidential preference primary. Sources in Washington say that

Bentsen will be challenged in the senatorial primary by a strong and articulate conservative, Texas A&M University Prof. W. Philip Gramm. It is around Gramm, an academic who writes and talks political and economic freedom, that a coalition of Texas Democrats is forming because Bentsen has gone widely to the political left in his bid to secure the presidential nomination.

First, Bentsen has made a powerful enemy of the governor of Texas because he favored the extension of the voting rights act that the governor was against.

Second, Bentsen has alienated the left of the party in Texas headed former U.S. Sen. Ralph Yarborough whom Bentsen beat: Yarborough is now seriously threatening to support Gramm in the Democratic primary.

Third, Bentsen has managed to make a political enemy of his onetime champion and supporter, former Texas Gov. John Connally, who is also threatening to throw his support behind

that Bentsen's presidential bid is a direct move to sandbag Wallace next year and that he has been encouraged to do this by Democratic Party Chairman Robert Strauss. Fifth, the Wallace and Connally factions are up in arms over Bentsen's support of busing, already an explosive issue in Dallas, stirring up a storm as it has elsewhere in the nation.

Sixth, and perhaps most important, is Bentsen's alienation of the Texas business community.

Gramm has spent the last six months speaking to some 90,000 Texas businessmen scoring Bentsen's pro-biggovernment position, particularly his votes to end the oil companies' foreign tax credits and to end the oil-depletion allowance. Gramm is an authority on energy, having held high positions with the U.S. and Canadian governments. He has also written widely on the energy crisis, his major thesis being the government, not the oil companies, has created the current energy crisis.

Bentsen's campaign organization for the presidency in Washington is circulating reprints of an ad showing an oil well with the question: "What does it tell you about a U.S. senator from Texas when he votes to slash big oil's foreign tax credits and end the depletion allowance for the major oil companies? It tells you he's got

Gramm's supporters are circulating this ad widely among Texas

oil businessmen and its effect is beginning to cost Bentsen in political support. At the same time, Bentsen is pushing in the Senate co-authorship of a bill to bail New York out of the mess of its own making.

If one, therefore views the growing fight in Texas on a national level, the various factions fighting Bentsen are the very factions of the Democratic Party that will be expected to nominate a presidential candidate here.

The time was in presidential politics that New Hampshire was considered the state to watch for a clue to the political future. But Texas may prove to be a more accurate barometer, indicating that the political weather here in New York next year may prove as hurricane-like as the storms that sweep out from the Gulf of Mexico to batter the Texas coastline.

## **Panel To Ask If Huston Plan Ever Implemented**

WASHINGTON (AP) - The Senate intelligence committee is seeking to determine whether U.S. intelligence agencies ever used break-ins, wiretapping and mail surveillance to spy on American citizens.

Such tactics, envisioned by the so-called Huston plan dur-ing the Nixon administration, will be the focal point as the committee opens a second week of public hearings.

The plan, designed to improve domestic intelligence gathering, was officially withdrawn by President Nixon in July 1970, only five days after it went into effect. But Chairman Frank Church, D-Idaho, said Monday that the com-mittee would probe "what was going on for a long time before then and for a long time after."

Former White House aide Tom Charles Huston, who acknowledged in a much publicized memo that some of the proposed tactics were "clearly illegal," is scheduled to be the lead-off witness at today's hear-
