"essentially unreliable" statistics which, nevertheless, can be turned against the responding companies.
This is something which should attract the attention and action of
every business. The USCC knows whereof it speaks.

Corporate Patterns Report (CPR) program was dispatched to more than 1,300 firms likely to receive one or more of the CPR questionnaires.
The chamber, at the same time produced an analysis of the CPR ploye formerly associated with the program.
Washington Report, a publicaiion of the USCC, says, "Dr. Wilwho recently retired as chief, Division of Financial Statistics, branded the information to be gathred as 'fundamentally and irrevocably flawed.
Nant in the world could the FTC want with such "flawed" information? And how does it expect to use such data?
