It is thought that a well of this kind can be obtained at a reasonable cost. and the beuefits to be derived therefrom would be innumerable The water would be so much better, and enongh water in one body to accommodate any purpose that we should want it for. It would afford an abundance of water $f(r \mathbf{r}$ a sys. tem of water works, for the entire town, to supply the domestic deeds of the city, besides it would be an ideal water supply for fire protection. It is suggested that a stock company be formed for the purpose of putting down a well of this kind. One man proprses to furnish the lots to put it on. Amarillo. Plainview, Big Springs and and Seminole are figuring on this kind of water supply and we are of the opiniou thet it is a good scheme.
