## OLD SETTLER PASSES AWAY

Last Saturday Morning While Working in The Yard at His Home In Southwest Lubbock
W. E. PENNEY SUDDENLY DROPPED DEAD

He Was One of the Oldest Settlers of Lubbock County His Remains Were Laid to Rest in Lubbock Ceme tery-Services at the Family Residence.

A gloom was cast over Lubbock last Saturday morning when the announcement was made from the Penney residence that W. E. Penney was dead.
At first the report could hardly be credited as true but investigation soon revealed the fact that he report was sadly true, and hat one of Lubbock's best and most highly esteemed and uniersally loved citizens into the great beyond.
His death was very sudden, and therefore unexpected, as the day before he was down in town seemingly in the bloom of health and was in his usual jolly mood.
And in fact the morning before his death he had walked to the home of his son P. B. Penney a distance of several blocks and refurned home without any complaint of feeling badly, and after有 this trip segan to hen fond he gronnd dead, just as thou h he had fallen, and no visable signs of any struggle was noticed and it s supposed he had been seized with a severe attack of hear trouble, which we have learne since he was somewhat subject to

Mr. Penney was born in Law ence Distrit, South Carohna, Oct 7th, 1843. He moved with his father to Georgia when only years of age where he resided for many years and was married in Enharlee Georgia in 1864 to Miss Martha Barett and was converted and joined the Methodist charch in 1865 of which he was a fathful member for 9 years after which he joined the Baptist church and lived a devoted christian in that denomination till the time of his death.
Mr. Penney moved to Texas in the year 1876 and located in Independence, Washington county, where he resided for twelve years then moved to Browi county where he remained 10 ing here in 1899 being one of the oldest settlers in Lubbock county.

He served four hard years in the civil war, and was a true southener and in his aged days seemed to en joy talking of the olden times.

amendment making sweeping amendment making sweeping
changes in the legislature branches of the state government. The mos salient clause of the bill are:
That the legislature shall mee regularly but one in four years. That the governor shall eall ext session when occasion demands. That there be but 64 representa tives instead of 136 and 19 senato instead of 31,
That each men ar of the legisla ture shall receix a salary of $\$ 60$ per year
That in event 4 bill passes one
branch of the legislature and the other branch fails to concur within ten days. the speaker of the house shall call for joint session and make the bill the order of the da until disposed of. each member of the legislature, senator and repres ntative shall, havé an equal vote. Mr. Jenkins' bill will apportio the representation by having represenatives to each congression al district and one senator to eac district. But in order that the representation should be equally d vided the bill provides that no county shall be divided. For ins ance, in this district, San Antonio would probably. according to pop ulation, be entilled to more tha one representative, but only on

lengthening the term of office of the legislature to four years in lead of two years
The bill will no doubt cause mor comment than any measure that has been introduced since some of the famous Hogg amendments and Mr. Jenkins thinks that the mea ure will have to ke fought out be fore it will finally pass. Witn the great number of members in the egislature there will be many who will not vote to reduce the size of the and thereby deprive man of them of the offices.
