crease of $\$ 5,290,773$ in whiskey crease of $\$ 5,290,773$ in whiskey
tax receipts as shown by the preliminary report of the internal revenue bureau just issued by acting Commissioner Robert Williams Jr. Whisky tax collections last year were $\$ 134,868,034$, as
against $\$ 140,158,807$ for the preceding year. The receipts beer and other fermented liquors amounted to $\$ 57,546,511$, a decrease of $\$ 2,351,205$ compared
with 1908. The nation's tobacco will, however, showed an increase The government tax on all sorts of tobacco aggregated $\$ 51,887,-$ 118, an increase of $\$ 2,024,423$ margarine tax collections were compared with the year before Internal revenue receipts from all sources were $\$ 246,212,719$. The government expended ap-
proximately $\$ 4,976,000$ in collectproximately $\$ 4,976,00 n u$ its internal revenues.

## State Banks Popular

A dispatch from Austin under
date of August the 4th states
that there were nineteen State
banks chartered during the
month of July and applications
for charters of several more are
in the hands of the Secretary of
State. Some of the charters are
to be passed upon while others
are awaiting correctian and
proper remittances in filing fees
and franchise tax. With the
nineteen charted last month a
total of 509 State banks have
filed their charters in Texas, but
of that number 35 have liqui-
dated, leaving net 474 in exis
tance. Not all of the banks
chartered last month have open
ed their doors, but half of them
have and and the others will
commence business within the
next ten days. By the time the
guaranty system commences
operation, which will be on Jan
pary 1 next there will be fully uary 1 next, there will be fully 500 State banks in operation in
Texas.
