#### MEXICO'S CLAIM TO EL PASO

Only Small Tract Involved in Dispute With U. S. Gov-

Washington.—The dispute over land titles in El Paso, Which for more than a year has been the subject of negotiations between the United States and Mexico, known as the Chamizal lands, are expected to be diplomatically settled this winter. The instability of the Rio Grande channel is responsible for the cloud which has been cast on the titles in question, Mexico claiming that under the accepted method of disignation which lands are in the United States and which are in Mexico by reason of sudden changes of the river channel, the disputed lands are Mexican territory. The recent discovery of documents, which a dispatch from the city of Mexico says establishes Mexico's claim to the entire city of El Paso, has reference only to the Chamizal claim and involves only a very small but valuable tract of El Paso land. Mexico apparently places great importance on the discovery as upholding her contention in the dispute over the Chamizal lands, and was to assist the Mexican Ambassador to present tais new information clearly and technically to the State Department that Beletrany Buga, the Mexican international boundary commissioner at El Paso, came to Washington recently.

#### State Banks Popular

A dispatch from Austin under date of August the 4th states that there were nineteen State banks chartered during the month of July and applications for charters of several more are in the hands of the Secretary of State. Some of the charters are to be passed upon while others are awaiting correctian and proper remittances in filing fees and franchise tax. With the nineteen charted last month a total of 509 State banks have filed their charters in Texas, but of that number 35 have liquidated, leaving net 474 in existance. Not all of the banks chartered last month have opened their doors, but half of them have and and the others will commence business within the next ten days. By the time the guaranty system commences operation, which will be on January 1 next, there will be fully 500 State banks in operation in

The increase in the number of State banks last month is attributed to the natural growth of the State, coupled with the provisions of the guaranty law. The law becomes effective on the 10th, or next Tuesday, but the State banks have until Oct. 1 to select the system of guaranty they will have and then give until January 1 to put up the pro rata fuud or bond and start the system. Private banks are limited to the bond system. Of approximately 100 State banks which have prematurely notified the Commissioner of Banking of the selection of a guaranty system, every one of them has selected the assessment plan. The notifications will have to be made again after next Tuesday and before Oct. 1.
