The most competent judges declare that the crack cav- | Alfalfa Pork Maker <br> Alfalfa has in numerous instances proven to be the open sesame to profitable pork making, and the more trials that are made of it as a cheap pork maker the more positive its value is asserted. An instance of its value is the experience of Edward P. Brown, an extensive swine breeder and feeder of Nebraska, and Nebraska is not nearly so favorable for growing alfalfa as Texas. <br> Mr. Brown realized in a fouryear experiment on the product of sixteen sows $\$ 31.72$ per acre annualiy from his alfalfa pasture used "with moderate grain ration" bes des $\$ 10$ worth of hay per acre annually; also is $1-2$ cents per bushel for his corn. By this method his pork cost for frain consumed in the resective years 21.2 cents, $21-4$ cents 22.3 cents and 13.4 cents per pound.
