

Baird School Tax Rate Remains Same; Two New Teachers Hired

BAIRD — The Baird School Board decided not to raise the school tax rate for 1973, during last week's regular session.

The rate, which was dropped from \$1.87 in 1971 to \$1.85 in 1972, will remain at \$1.85 this year, with \$48 to be used for local maintenance and \$37 for

debt service. August 14 was set for the budget hearing for the 1973-74 school year.

A coach and a math teacher were hired to complete the faculty for the coming year.

John Dankworth will assist in the athletic program and teach Physical Science and Speech. He is a graduate of Ballinger High School and Angelo State University. He coached last year at Laredo United in Laredo.

Floyd Wimberly will teach math. He has a B. S. degree from Hardin-Simmons University and the Masters Degree from the University of Utah.

He previously taught in Ballinger, from 1950 to 1958, and in Los Alamos, N. M. High School for the past 14 years.

School Bells to Ring Monday, August 20

42nd District Grand Jury Indicts Canada for Murder With Malice

BAIRD — A 42nd District Grand Jury reindicted Selan Canada for "murder with malice aforethought" in the shooting of Callahan County Deputy Sheriff Luke Taylor on March 2nd.

The Grand Jury met on July 19th, and also indicted two men, L. H. Roberts of Hamby for cattle theft, and Robert Kennedy for burglary of the Hal Broadfoot Texaco Station in Clyde.

Canada was indicted on April 12 with "assault with intent to murder," and the trial tentatively set for July 16th. Since that date the deputy has remained in critical condition and was moved to Clyde Nursing Home, and died June 4th. The Deputy was hit in the forehead by several pellets from a .410 gauge shotgun. The shooting occurred northwest of Baird on

land leased by Canada, who was free on \$5,000 bond, posted shortly after the shooting.

The Grand Jury voted to change from attempted murder to murder, with a new trial date to be set after arraignment proceedings, possibly sometime this week.

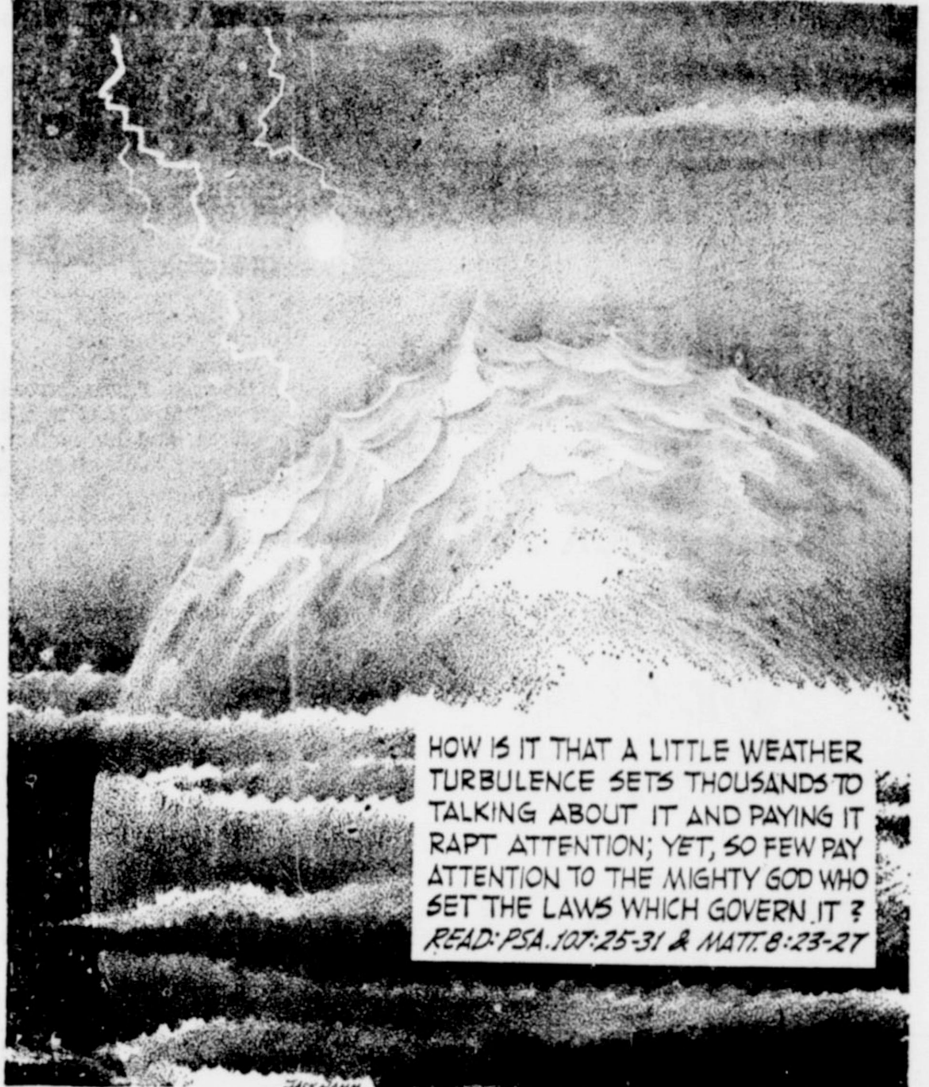
