

PROPOSED AMENDMENT TO THE STATE CONSTITUTION, GIVING THE LEGISLATURE FOWER TO GIVE OR LEND, OR AUTHORIZE THE GIVING OR LENDING, OF THE CREDIT OF THE STATE FOR THE PURPOSE OF ASSISTING CITIZENS, HEADS OF FAMILIES TO ACQUIRE OR IMPROVE THEIR HOMES
