Control of the Leaf Worm When the insect appears in destructive numbers, dusting with the proper arsenical powder with the will control it. Dry arsenate o lead is best, and should be applied at the rate of about three pounds per acre. There is little danger of burning the foliage with this poison. Paris Green applied in dust form is effective, but is apt to burn the foliage, and only about one and a half pounds per acre should be used. Further, it should always be diluted with about two parts of air slacked lime to one part the poison. London purple is also quite apt to burn, but if no other poison is available, might be used with great caution, in the same way as advised for Paris




