Locating Committee Went into Executive Session in the Texas Hotel at Fort Worth at Nine O'clock and after Five Hours Deliberation Unanimously Designated Lubbock as the Official Location for the Technological College

Fort Worth, August 8.—Lubbock was Unanimous Choice of the Locating Board for the Texas Technological College on the First Ballot at the five hour Session of the Board here today. The Decision was made following a six months study of the briefs of the 35 applicant towns and a three weeks tour of inspection of theterritory. At 1:42 o'clock Wednesday afternoon one of the members of the Board whose name was not divulged moved that a ballot be taken and his motion prevailed. The roll was then called and every member voted for Lubbock. The Board had been in session practically continuous since 9:00 o'clock Wednesday morning and during that time various other towns were discussed.

The announcement read: "Having made a careful study of the original and supplemental briefs and having visited and inspected all the sites offered by thirty-six applicant towns and having given consideration to relative merits of the propositions submitted by the several towns, we hereby elect and designate Lubbock, in Lubbock County, Texas, as the official location of Texas Technological College

By the United Press LOS ANGELES, Aug. 8.—Scient tric fan kept it gently waving thru-Southern California making prepara-tion for the most complete scientific observations of a total eclipse of the sun thus far known.

The eclipse will occur September 10. It is the first total eclipse in this district for nearly 120 years, and will be the last until 2045 A.

The total eclipse will only clip the extreme southwest portion of the United States, beginning a little north of San Diego.

Many of the scientists are preparing to take their instruments to the little seacoast town of Ensenada. in Lower California, Mexico, where the total eclipse will last the great est length of time.

Many Nations Represented. Groups of scientists from England, France, Belgium, Italy, Spain, Germany, Japan and other countries are planning to view the eclipse, take photographs and make ocular observations of widespread charac-
