FORTVILIE, Ind., Feb. 2. Twelve persons were killed and
between 30 and 50 others were iniured, some so badly that death
is imninent, in a head-on collision between two crowded inter-
urban cars near here late today.
The crash occured on a curve while the cars were traveling
at a rate estimated at 50 miles an hour.
Fire burst out a few moments after the collision. The wreck-
age was a mass of flames.
While rescuers looked hopelessly on, several of the injured
were slowly burned to death. Many of them prayed for death to
relieve them of their pain.
