### AGRICULTURAL SLIDES CAN BE SECURED AT CANYON

CANYON, Texas, Aug. 14.—The West Texas State Teachers College hopes to render a service to the Agriculture and Home Economics workers in West Texas by furnishing lantern slides and agricultural charts. The Agriculture department of the college has entered into an agreement with the International Harvester Company and slides will be kept at all times in the department for free distribution to the county agents, Agriculture teachers, Home Economics teachers and other rural workers. The only expense in connection with this work will be the transportation charges which will be kept at a minimum. Charts and slides may be obtained concerning the following subjects: Control of flies, canning, gardening, alfalfa, dairying, poultry, live stock managing and various other subjects of interest to rural communities.
