#### Roland McCormick

A church service for Roland McCormick, 78, of Muleshoe was held Saturday, May 14, 2005, at the Muleshoe Church of Christ with Barry Wiseman and Dr. Kerry Moore officiating. Burial was in Muleshoe Memorial Park Cemetery.

McCormick was born Jan. 17, 1927, in Spur. He died Wednesday, May 11, 2005. He married Martha Ray Cudd in Slaton on Sept. 16, 1951.

He was preceded in death by two sisters and four brothers.

McCormick had lived in Muleshoe since 1956, moving from Slaton. He served his country in WWII and the Korean Conflict, earning two purple hearts and a silver star. He was a past president of the Lions Club and the Lubbock Boat Club. He served on the board of the Heritage Foundation and the hospital board.

McCormick was active in mission campaigns to Africa and Mexico. He owned and operated McCormick Seed Company, which he started in 1979. He was a member of the Muleshoe Church of Christ.

Survivors include his wife Martha of Muleshoe; a son - Tim of Muleshoe; a daughter - Cathy Branscum and her husband Sawnie of Muleshoe; four sisters - Doris Thomas of Acuff, Patsy Boyd of Slaton, Shirley Roney of Lubbock, and Martha Haddock of Houston; two brothers Ronny McCormick of Desdamona, and Jack McCormick of Michigan; nine grandchildren and eight great-grandchildren.

#### Jessie H. Clayton

A church service for Jessie H. Clayton, 85, of Morton, was held Wednesday, May 18, 2005, at the First United Methodist Church with Joey Pierce officiating. Burial followed at the Morton Memorial Cemetery.

Clayton died Sunday, May 15, 2005, at Cochran Memorial Hospital. He was born March 17, 1920, in Plainview, and married Waydia Green in 1941. He was preceded in death by his wife in 1942, and by his son Phil in 1990.

Clayton served in the U.S. Army, and married Pattie Stinson in February 1947, moved to Morton in 1949 and farmed until his retirement in 1985. He was an active member in the community, and served on several local boards, including the FHA, ASCS, Morton School Board, and the Bailey County Electric Coop.







wasn't looking for anything particularly profound the other day, just enjoying a good book, a great story, and a quiet meal when I stumbled across a little nugget of wisdom that surprised me. Sometimes that which is truly profound and wise reaches out and grabs us unexpectedly. Well, yes, we think, that is so true, so true that we're a little surprised we hadn't thought of it or put it into words ourselves. But we recognize the ring of truth and "Amen" it with a whispered, "Yes, that's right!"



And here's what I mined during lunch the other day that struck me as holding a glittering nugget of truth: "If you want to know what a man's like, take a good look at how he treats his inferiors, not his equals" (J. K. Rowling).
