CHARBON.

By Dr. M. H. Boerner, Austin.

HISTOTY OF THE DISEASE IN TEXAS Statements come to this office that charbon has existed in East Texas for the last 40 to 50 years. There have been annual visitations almost regularly, and occasional visitations of epidemic proportions during more recent times, frequen tly so devastating as to kill stock in such great numbers that the prairies were dotted with charbon

In West Texas charbon is a more recent plague. The earliest repor ted epidemic was about 20 years ago in the mountainous regious of Edwards and Bandera counties. Probably because of the droughts and the sparse population, another epidemic did not appear until ten years ago. Since 1903, until this season, in West Texas, live stock have died each year of cnar. bon, but only in small numbers and in sporadic cases.

GEOGRAPHICAL DI TRIBUTION.
