Proper Care Bestowed on Them Has Been Found to Pay in More Ways Than One.

In course of the clean-up and paintp movement, which produced good results in many towns and cities, repairs of all sorts were brought about. The householder who looked over his property in the spring, with a view of merely removing rubbish from back yards and alleys, found that there was much to be done, and as a result of recent experiences in war economies has been inclined to study methods of




