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Cooling Milk in Winter Important

Dairyman is Advised to Use Well Insulated Tank and Clean Quarters.

A can of milk that stands overnight may appear to have been cooled properly because some of the milk freezes. Slow cooling before it freezes makes an inferior grade of milk, and in addition, the frozen milk usually stays in the can when the milk is dumped at the milk plant or station.

Neither is the setting of milk in a snow bank or on a cake of ice during winter nights a satisfactory way to cool milk. The can on a cake of ice will cool at the bottom and thus will cool the milk in the bottom of the can.

It is placed on top of the cool milk stays at the bottom and the warm milk remains on top; hence, all the milk is never cooled.

Warehouse Board Sealers Rule on Handling Corn: Due to the high percentage of moisture contained in the corn in some sections, the Iowa department of agriculture recently made a ruling that no corn will be sealed by the warehouse board sealers which is a greater distance than four feet from a slatted side of a crib or a suitable ventilator.

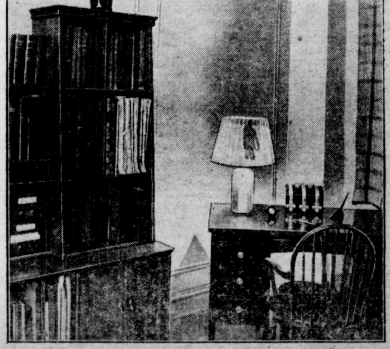
Highest Railway: Fremont pass on the Denver & Rio Grande is the highest part of any United States railway, being 11,550 feet above sea level.

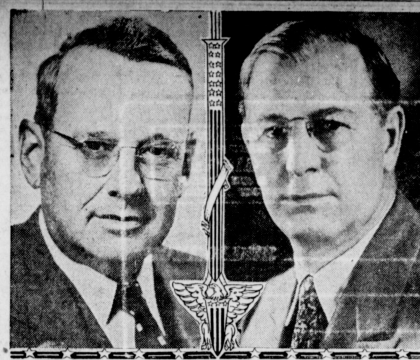

Texas Highway Men Play Role Of Good Samaritan To Many

That the Texas highway patrol is an important feature for correcting highway law violations, helping folks in accidents, uprooting other accidents and giving out much desired and valuable information, is evident from the report of last month's activities just made public as follows:

Assistance was rendered 479 persons. Information was given 274 others and obstructions dangerous to traffic were removed from the highways in 135 instances.

A total of 9,619 drivers were warned for various infractions of road rules while 1,607 were given tickets, of which 449 were for over-weight, 24 for careless driving and 377 for speeding.

Five persons were arrested on hit and run charges, 26 for driving while intoxicated and 211 for license violations.

The patrol estimated that additional registration fees paid to tax collectors through efforts of the patrol amounted to \$20,130.94, while fines assessed in justice courts totaled \$15,597 giving a total of \$35,727.88.

Operating expenses of the department, including salaries, were \$19,967.65.

Meantime, patrolmen continued to push the statewide safety campaign through safety lane work, today having tested the safety appliances of approximately 40,000 automobiles, as a service without cost to the motorists.

First aid lectures have been given before scores of schools and civic clubs in those sections where safety lane work was conducted.

There have been 114 enrolled in the school to date. Certificates of award will be given those completing the course.
