to the Oil Fields (BY THE "DEVIL", HIMSELF)

wfe and kid remained in Big Lake, published annually in America. while the Devil journeyed over to the oil fields.

First, I visited the Big Lake field, where that field has been producing twenty-five to thirty thousand barrels of 38-gravity oil for the past four years. In that field the discovery well, the Santa Rita No. 1, was continuing its production of 100 barrels daily. The production in the Big Lake field has been pinched, due to the low price of crude.

From there I went to the McCamey area in Upton county. McCamey is a growing oil town. Two years ago, the writer was in that town where all its inabitants, numbering only twenty-five, including the promoters of the new town. But, today, there is a population of seven thousand in the town of McCamey and the McCamey oil fields. This is a typical West Texas oil field town seething with acitvity. We barely found parking space there.

Continuing our travel we rest went through alkali dust about a yard deep to the famous Yates field-a field that has a potential production of half a million barrels daily, and the biggest shallow wells in the State I aw where the big 65,000 barrel well ame in. The mountain sides, some of them inclining for more than a half mile were blackened with oil from the gushers. There are three towns which have recently sprung up almost over night in this field. The first town Iraan, which gets its name sake from Mr. and Mrs. Ira G. Yates, is now own of two to three thousand people not to mention the workmen in the field. While here we walked into a little tailor shop about 20x30 and asked what a building this size would rent for per month. The proprietor calmly told us that he was paying 100 per month, and that other buildings no larger were commanding more than

The Yates field is in Pecos county longside the Pecos River. It was o us while there, that Pecos unty was going to be divided into two separate counties, the new county to be named Yates county. A block in Iraan has been designated as the site for the new court house. We were also in Red Barn, the Yates headquarter ranch town. Mr. Yates has leased this site to Halamicek Brothers of Big Lake for a period of five years. This new town is right in the heart of the oil fields. Across the river, about a half mile, in Crockett county, a new town is being built The man Borger, who promoted the Borger townsite, and a man by the name of Grube, are putting on this new site. They, according to reports emanating from reliable sources, will run this new town "as an oil field town should be handled." We were talking to a cafe man there who said that everything in this new town would "run wide open." You know what that means if you are familiar with oil town slang. **Tom Turner Kills** Bear! 




